In answer to the question "What is the PCC and the PC?". The Parochial Church Council (PCC) looks after St Nicholas' Church with income from donations and covenants, for example, to provide regular services and maintenance of the fabric of the building. The Grafton Parish Council (PC) is responsible for the general environment of the parish, planning applications, maintenance of footpaths etc and income is derived from a proportion of your council tax.

### THE CHURCH of St NICHOLAS ROOF APPEAL



Building commenced on our Norman style Church almost 173 years ago and it still serves us well today.  
**But now it needs your help - and time is against us!**

Repairs include work to the roof and the extensive specialist guttering and drainpipes. Severe internal flooding seen over the last two winters may soon cause irreparable damage to the fabric of the church if allowed to continue.

Following consultation with the diocese, architects, surveyors and builders, the necessary repairs will cost approximately **£33,000** - this is a huge challenge

A grant of **£2,500** has already been obtained from the Wiltshire Historical Churches Trust and an "Autumn Statement Roof Repairs" grant from the Government is also being sought.

Whilst many of us do not necessarily wish to attend regular Church services, most of us want and expect our Church to be available at important times in our personal lives, such as family baptisms, weddings and, inevitably, funerals. We are very fortunate to have such a beautiful Church in our Parish. We must surely do what is necessary to preserve it for future generations.

Regular service collections, however generous, from our small congregations barely cover annual church expenses.



### Our Doctor writes

Look Out for Lyme!

On the 18 January there was an event at the Houses of Parliament to raise the awareness of the importance of Lyme disease. And given our locality, Lyme is a particular risk especially in Spring and Autumn and so we are more vulnerable in the next few months.

Lyme disease is an infection that is transmitted by the bite of the deer tick. With lots of wild deer about it is understandable why we are in one of the hot spots. There is a reservoir of infection in wild deer but it also affects other animals as well. Lyme was first described in the 1970's in Connecticut in a town called Lyme – hence the name. The infection has many similarities to syphilis. After being bitten by a tick the first sign of an infection is a spreading rash which develops over a few weeks. It spreads out from the point of the bite but it can also develop at a site distant from the bite. There are often associated low grade flu like symptoms with this first stage. Untreated the rash slowly fades and the bacteria continues to multiply within the body but manages to do this without provoking a response from the immune system. Over time the immune system seems to become partially aware that there is a problem and the body produces a reaction which is poorly targeted and this then also becomes part of the problem. Untreated Lyme disease can cause serious health problems in most systems in the body.

It's not all gloom and doom though. There are two important things we can do. The first is to try to prevent tick bites in the first place. This isn't fool proof but simply tucking trousers in socks or wearing walking gaiters can help. Ticks are found in grassy areas and in areas of leaf mould (lots in the Savernake Forest!). The second is to pick it up in its early stage with the spreading rash which is easy to treat with a two week course of antibiotics. Later stage disease is still treatable but a longer course with perhaps a different antibiotic being used if the nervous system is involved. There are lots of causes of hard to understand general malaise and only a small minority of these will be caused by Lyme. That said it is worth raising the possibility with your doctor if you have a difficult to understand illness as Lyme should at least be considered
