Our Doctor Writes

All of you should have received a text message or a letter informing you that I am your named accountable GP. The named GP is largely a role of oversight, with the requirement being introduced to reassure patients they have one GP within the practice who is responsible for ensuring that work is carried out on their behalf. Although Dr Tim Ballard is still a partner, he is not seeing patients, which is why I am, as the only clinical partner, the named accountable GP for everyone registered. This does not mean that you have to see me though! You may see any GP or nurse working at the practice. Many of you already see Dr Hannah Graystone regularly. She has been our salaried GP for almost 3 years. Dr Anne Woods started on the 1st April as a salaried GP and in the future may become my new partner. I have asked her if she will write an introduction for herself in next month's issue. Dr Julia Hempenstall is returning from maternity leave in June to complete her training. She will be with us for only a month. In August our new trainee Dr Jenny Yin will start and be with us for a year. Clearly it's not raining men! For those who prefer to see a male doctor we have Dr Mario Sofroniou or Dr Peter Hetherington available almost every week.

If you have not received a letter or text it means we do not have your correct address or mobile number, so please let reception know. By the time you read this we will have had an inspection from the Care Quality Commission (CQC). During the inspection five key questions are asked about the quality and safety of services: are they safe, are they effective, are they caring, are they responsive and are they well-led. Also assessed is how services are provided to people in specific groups including older people, people with long term conditions, working age people, people whose circumstances may make them vulnerable, people experiencing poor mental health and families, children and young people. I will let you know the results.

The Army Basing Programme

Major development to support the Army Basing Programme which will bring 4,000 military personnel and their families to Wiltshire has been agreed subject to conditions.

This programme will transform Salisbury Plain into the Army's largest training area in the UK with three high readiness Reaction Force Brigades based in Wiltshire by 2019.

Wiltshire Council has been working with the Defence Infrastructure Organisation (DIO), the Army and partner organisations to ensure the right level of facilities and services including education, transport, leisure and healthcare provision are in place in time for the relocation of service personnel and their families.

Three planning applications to build a total of 917 homes for service personnel in Larkhill, Ludgershall and Bulford are being considered by the Strategic Planning Committee.
