Our Doctor Writes by Dr Angela Paddon.

Last month I wrote about different types of dementia. This time I will explain how a diagnosis is made and the treatment and the support available. There is no single test to diagnose dementia - if you are worried that someone has dementia, encourage them to go the GP, and suggest that you go with them. A short memory test will give a good indication of a person's cognitive ability; blood tests can exclude illnesses which can affect the memory and it is important to ensure that the memory is not being affected by depression or medicine a person is taking. An MRI scan of the head can provide information about blood vessel damage or signs of a stroke in addition to the size of the brain and brain shrinkage.

GPs assess patients, start and monitor drug treatment for mild to moderate dementia, review patients and provide advice and support for carers. You can be referred to a memory clinic for further diagnosis if you are young; there is diagnostic uncertainty; a rarer form of dementia is suspected such as fronto-temporal lobe or Creudzfelt-Jakob dementia; for dementia associated with Parkinson's disease; when behaviour is challenging; if there is failure to tolerate donepezil or in dementia which is progressing in severity.

If you are diagnosed with dementia it is important that you try to stimulate your brain by keeping up your interests and being physically active. It is also important to make decisions about your future while you still can. You should make a will and an advance directive. You can officially appoint someone you trust to make decisions for you by making and registering a lasting power of attorney (LPA). Information and forms are available on the GOV.UK website or you can contact The Office of the Public Guardian on 0300 456 0300. A solicitor or The Citizen's Advice Bureau can also help.

A carer is a relative or friend who provides unpaid support to someone who would not otherwise be able to cope with the activities of daily living without them. If you live with or help someone who lives alone and dementia is diagnosed, you are invited to join a carer's support group. Carer Support Wiltshire can assess your needs, give advice about activities and respite for you (**www.carersinwiltshire.co.uk**, **0800181 4118**).

Alzheimer's Support run memory café's and Singing for the Brain groups which offer a friendly, relaxed and welcoming environment. There is a memory café at the Coronation Hall on the first Monday of the month from 2-3.30. Alzheimer's support can be contacted on **01225 776481.**

The Care Co-ordinator based at your surgery can help you make contact with all the services above. They can also arrange for you to have an assessment by a social worker for care needs and funding available to you. You may be able eligible for an attendance or carer's allowance and a reduction in your council tax and they can help you apply for these. Sarah Davey and Mary Soellner are the care coordinators at The Old School Surgery and you can contact them via reception. I have asked Sarah and Mary to write about their roles in next month's magazine. There is a lot of information available about living with dementia on the excellent NHS Choices website.
