The Hall will be set out as a village tea shop with cakes and refreshments. Guests will be asked to group by their allocated tables and The Duchess will walk informally around the hall, to meet us and to find out about our community and how we achieved our goal.

If you are not successful in the ballot then you are most welcome to join us in the covered area in front of the hall at around 1pm where we are assured that you will have an opportunity to enjoy an informal end to the visit (weather dependent).

Everyone is welcome to come into the hall and enjoy refreshments after the Royal Party has departed.

Whilst the timing of the Opening Ceremony is not ideal for everyone and we regret that the details of the event could not be announced earlier, we hope you agree that this will be a wonderful day for the Parish. Later in the year, when the warmer weather arrives, we hope to have a weekend Parish party.

Farewell, old friend

The Grafton Parish News produced its last edition in December 2009, after nearly 30 years of uninterrupted publication and distribution by dedicated volunteers in the Parish. The first mock-up was done by Goff and Anne Beese when locals in the Parish felt disadvantaged by being restricted to just one or two pages at the back of the Burbage Parish Magazine. Phyllis Gilbert persuaded her daughter, Libby, to type the new magazine, and John Gilbert worked out the format for printing. This first edition of the Grafton Parish News was very well received and thus the bi-monthly publication was born.

During the following years, Phyllis Gilbert helped Anne Beese to collate the contributions. Mark Williams donated the assembly and printing in the early days and later Libby Gilbert printed each edition, as well as continuing to do all the typing for it. At this stage, a new printer was donated by John Gilbert and the printing accessories were either made or adapted by him. The publication has always been self-financing, but the current ink and paper costs are now prohibitive.

Over the years, there have been a number of regular contributors, whose observations, comments and anecdotes have made the publication quite unique, for example Marie Dixon's interesting articles on birds. It is timely now to publicly thank all those who have helped to make the Grafton Parish News so successful for so many years.

Emergency Planning

Wiltshire Council organises exercises annually to enable local organisations, such as Parish Councils and the emergency services, to practice how they would react when presented with an emergency.

A team of volunteers open a series of sealed envelopes at certain times during the evening. Each envelope contains "lifelike" information on recent events, the time that has elapsed and problems to be tackled. The team then discusses solutions and reports back to Wiltshire Council HQ with updates.

The latest scenario was that the sun had emitted solar flares. These are a real threat and they produce magnetic pulses which can destroy power grids, as was demonstrated in Canada in 2003.

In the last exercise the power was operating to begin with, but it quickly went out and so we were putting together a communication system to deal with the emergency without electricity. As the exercise progressed, events compounded, accidents happened and we were forced to draw on diverse resources in our Parish!

Anyway, you will be pleased to know that we, as a Parish, are well placed to manage in such an emergency – we have wells and natural springs, wood burners, resourceful sheds and garages and most importantly, we have a community who we were certain would pull together in this sort of situation.

Grafton Life – an interview with Jamie Pearson

We continue our series of local features with the senior pupils at Grafton School interviewing Jamie Pearson, the Parish Councillor responsible for managing the building of the new Coronation Hall. By Liam, Jack, Cerys, Stacey and Louise.

The new hall seems to be much larger than the old one - was it a difficult project?

The new hall is around 20m long, 5m longer than the old one which makes it around 50% bigger than before. The planning and fundraising for the new hall took some time but the actual build was quite quick as we were determined to have it ready for the Parish Christmas Party. We had a really good team working on the project with around 15 builders and a project manager. Plus, the Parish Council divided up the main responsibilities between them. It was a great team effort.

What features and facilities are there in the new hall?

We wanted to make it the best we could so we managed to incorporate a sprung floor which makes it cushioned for dancing and yoga, there is a commercial kitchen which we hope will make the hall attractive for functions such as weddings and parties. There's also under floor heating, an air pump which keeps the temperature in the hall constant and an internet connection which can be used by people using the hall.

How much did the new hall cost?

The building and fit out costs were around £350,000. There were lots of fundraising events across the Parish and we were very lucky to receive grants from the Big Lottery and the former Kennet District Council.

Why did you get involved with the building of the new hall?

My job as a property trader means I have experience of the building trade. I have worked as a trader for 14 years, I buy land, mainly in London and other big cities and get planning permission before selling it on.

How long have you lived in Grafton and what do you do in your spare time.

I have lived in Hollow Lane, Wilton since 2002. I live with my wife Caroline, our children Olivia 2 and Edward 1. We have a pony called Twinkle and a horse named Ruby plus 2 dogs and a cat. In my spare time I enjoy watching Star Wars and X Factor. I support Liverpool Football Club.

Wiltshire Area Boards - Feedback Wanted!

Area Boards have been implemented, as part of the new Wiltshire Council, to provide a new way of involving people in local decisions.

Our locally elected councillors together with other organisations such as the Police, NHS, MOD, parish councils etc discuss issues within the community before decisions are made. Meetings are held locally every two months and the public are invited to participate. Area Boards also provide valuable access to community grant funds.

News in Brief

Traffic Speeds in Marten

Following the article in the Community News about speed checks and investigations in East Grafton and Wexcombe, we have received a number of comments about traffic speeds in Marten. These have been passed to the Parish Council for discussion at the next meeting and will be referred to the Police and transport authorities for consideration.

Grit Bins – Your help needed

The recent weather has prompted questions about the number and refilling of grit bins in the Parish. Wiltshire Council has over 1200 bins across the County but no records of any in this area. Please let us know at news@graftonparish.com if there is a bin in your area and its location, or if you feel a new bin is needed. The Parish Council will then ensure that the Council's records are updated and our bins will be on the bin refilling programme.

Digital Switchover is coming to Grafton – starts March 2010

If you receive your TV signal from the Mendip Transmitter (West TV rather than Meridian) you will probably be affected by the digital switchover that starts on March 24th. Digital TVs will need retuning, other TVs will need a set top box to continue receiving the new digital TV signal. More information is available at www.digitaluk.co.uk or on Tel **08456 50 50 50**. The Digital Switchover scheme is available to help over 75s, or those receiving certain allowances, to retune TV equipment.

Children's Road Safety - An urgent message for parents & drivers

Parents, please remind your children that if they are playing they should take extra care before crossing the road. And drivers, please remember that whilst the speed limit in that area is 30mph, there are often local children playing so please approach with caution.
