### Grafton Parish Council Meeting in May

It was a busy meeting with planning, hall updates and fundraising included, but not least of all was the re-election of the Parish Council. The new chairman is Chris Garman who was voted in unanimously and who takes over the role from Peter Lemon, whose 3 year tenure had come to an end. The council otherwise remains unchanged.

The last few years under Peter's leadership have been very successful and much has been achieved, including the realisation of the new Coronation Hall. Peter thanked everyone for their support.

Business discussed included the Speed Watch scheme which is progressing with 6 members of the Parish having received training in the use of the equipment. We are now awaiting confirmation for the proposed locations for it to take place.

The speed control data collection in Marten showed that the problem of actual speeding is insufficient for any action to be taken as the speed limit for the road is currently 60mph (the national speed limit). The next step is to investigate whether the speed limit can be reduced and this is being progressed.

The next meeting is on Thursday 1 July at 7.15pm at the Coronation Hall and everyone is welcome to attend.

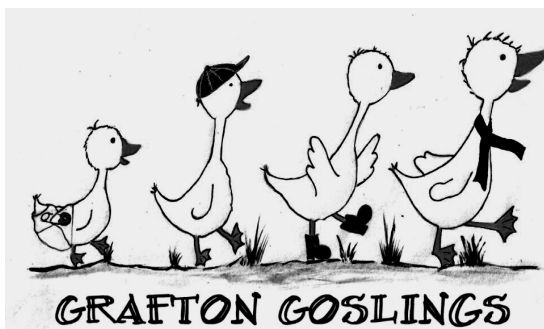

With SATs out of the way, Stacy, Cerys, Liam, Jack and Louise the Year 6 students at Grafton School are looking forward to starting Secondary School in September. In the meantime they have been busy interviewing more Grafton Parish residents for the Community News. In the hot seat this month, was Susie Brew – Parish Councillor, Secretary of Wilton Windmill Society and a member of the fundraising group for our own Public Access Defibrillators.

#### *Where do you live?*

I live with my husband Tim, and dogs Pebble and Percy in Wexcombe. We built our house a few years ago and we really enjoy living in Wexcombe despite the fact that it is colder and windier than the other villages in the parish, as it is higher up and more exposed.

#### *Where do you work?*

I used to work in London but a few years ago I decided I would like a more rural lifestyle. It means that we were able to get Pebble and Percy too, as it wouldn't have been fair to have dogs with Tim and I out for long periods most days. Now, I'm involved in a number of community initiatives so things are certainly no less hectic! I enjoy the fact that every day is different.

#### *What do you do in your spare time?*

I enjoy gardening – we're lucky to have enough space for a vegetable garden. I love cooking too, especially making chutney and cakes. Of course, I enjoy walking Pebble and Percy too.

#### *How are you getting on with fundraising for the Public Access Defibrillators?*

We're aiming to get a defibrillator for each of the five villages in Grafton Parish. As the parish is some distance from a hospital it's unlikely that the emergency services would reach a cardiac arrest patient in sufficient time. Each defibrillator costs around £2000 with training and installation so we're aiming to raise £10000.

The recent SOS Sausage Evening was a fantastic start and we raised over £800. We're hoping that our Grand Garage Sale taking place at the Coronation Hall on Saturday 12 June will be a great success too. We've also been selling air horns which are useful for alerting neighbours to an emergency. We have some left, so if anyone would like one just email **news@graftonparish.com** or pop a note in the letterbox at the hall. The air horns cost £10.

#### *Are the defibrillators easy to use?*

They are easy to use, they're really not very heavy and when the case is opened there are clear instructions. We will be running more training courses though when we start to install the defibrillators. More details in a future edition of the Community News.

The Society will look after the operation of the phone box in Wilton as a local Information Kiosk and the small membership fee will raise funds to ensure it is maintained.
