**Grafton Primary School – likely summer closure**

On Thursday 21 April the statutory notice of the proposal to close Grafton Primary School was published in the Gazette and Herald. Copies have subsequently been posted at Grafton and Great Bedwyn schools, Marlborough St John's Secondary School, Pewsey and Marlborough Libraries and by Grafton Parish Council. The notice has also been sent for information to all neighbouring schools and the Diocese by Wiltshire Council.

Objections to, or comments on, the proposal must be made by 2 June – they should be sent to Director for Children & Education, Wiltshire Council, School Buildings & Places, County Hall, Bythesea Road, Trowbridge, BA14 8JB.

The majority of pupils now have places confirmed at alternative schools of their choice from September and we hope that the remainder will be confirmed shortly. Meetings are taking place to consider options for the future of Sunflowers Pre school and the Parish Council's land and buildings working party has been established.

Planning is underway to mark the closure of our school with an event. Anyone, especially former pupils, who would like to get involved is invited to contact the school office on **01672 810478** or [admin@grafton.wilts.sch.uk](mailto:admin@grafton.wilts.sch.uk).

For pupils, parents and staff these final summer terms will be very special and a fantastic programme of activities has been put together, including collaborative work with our neighbouring schools, sports festivals and some amazing trips. It will be a summer to remember.

"The latest problem is that of off-road vehicles and motorcycles on the tracks and paths around the village. I am collating details, researching the options open and liaising with our Rural Crime Team so that we can have a joint initiative. If the vehicles and bikes are on private farm land and have permission from the landowner to be there, then we can do nothing. The ensuing nuisance regarding noise will have to be tackled through the Parish Council, the landowner and via the civil route."

**The Bedwyns' & Grafton Link Scheme** is a confidential service. A charity run by volunteers and funded by donations providing a service for people living in the Bedwyns and Grafton Parish.

Volunteers transport clients to and from medical appointments and local day-to-day engagements, make regular visits to keep people company, help with paperwork, dog-walks, errands and minor garden work and other small tasks. Volunteers are CRB checked and they control the hours and work done and claim a mileage allowance.

People use this vital service to increase their independence and improve their quality of life. It is available to young and old, for example if you are recovering from an accident or illness, you may need additional help.

The Link Scheme hosts a monthly coffee morning in the British Legion Hall in Great Bedwyn on the first Tuesday of every month from 11am to noon, to which everyone is welcome.

**Bedwyn Patients' Participation Group** are hosting coffee mornings in the Great Bedwyn Legion Hall at 11am every 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of the month. Anyone in the Great Bedwyn surgery catchment area who would enjoy some company and a cup of tea is welcome to go along and it is free.

Wiltshire Council recently announced that £16 million will be spent on improving internet access to businesses and families across the county. It's unlikely that more than a few places in Grafton Parish currently have access to standard broadband speeds of 2 mbps or above. So it would be fantastic to achieve this – let alone have high speed broadband of 20mbps and above.

To prioritise and target the areas which have the greatest need the council is gathering information from residents and businesses across the county. ### Our Doctor writes:

"Getting trained to use defibrillators is well worth doing. A recent study in Seattle showed an amazing 50% of people successfully defibrillated in the community were eventually discharged from hospital. There is a risk that following resuscitation an individual may be left with a disability but without the opportunity for an early defibrillation the outlook is very bleak indeed. Defibrillators have an in built computerised decision making programme that will only deliver a shock if appropriate. When local communities raise the money for equipment themselves then I think that congratulations are in order.
