
## The Parish celebrates the contribution made by Goff Beese on both the Parochial Church Council and the Parish Council

#### Broadband news

Wiltshire Council has announced the start of a project which should enable 91 per cent of homes and businesses to have access to world class broadband speeds by the end of March 2016 The remaining premises will see a significant improvement in their speeds and the vast majority will receive greater than 2Mbps.

Following the contract signing there will be a period of planning, with work expected to start on the ground during the autumn. The first exchanges enabled under the project are expected to go live with fibre in spring 2014.

#### OUR DOCTOR WRITES by Dr Tim Ballard

People are often confused by the differences between chicken pox and shingles. Both are caused by the Varicella virus.

When first exposed to this virus the illness we know as chicken pox is what usually develops. Chicken pox is an illness that is still relatively common in children and usually runs a mild course with spots developing over a few days then scabbing over and then gradually healing. It is infectious for up to 3 days before the first spots appear (or just before) and remains infectious for about 5 days after the last spot has arrived. The incubation period is 14 to 21 days. After having chicken pox the virus is never completely eradicated. It takes refuge in nerve cells where they lie inactive, often for the rest of our lives. Occasionally though they are reawakened though and when this happens they emerge as shingles.

Very early shingles can be tricky to diagnose. Often people have pain in one particular area of the body and then only a few days later a rash develops. It is possible to catch chicken pox from shingles but not the other way around.

It is important to avoid people with immune problems (especially those with leukaemia and on chemotherapy) and pregnant women if you have either chicken pox or shingles. You also can't catch shingles from shingles either. Shingles can be very painful and one big problem with it is that this pain can remain as neuralgia long after the rash has all healed. If you think you are developing shingles please contact your GP straight away. The sooner antiviral treatment starts the more effective it is. There is also evidence that it decreases the long term nerve pain that can be associated with shingles.

#### Police Neighbourhood Watch Update

January was a busy month on Neighbourhood Watch, with regular updates coming through from the Pewsey East Police Team.

There has been suspicious activity reported in Shalbourne, and more recently in Burbage, with cold callers knocking on doors claiming to be from charities or utility companies. Be cautious when answering the door to 'cold callers'. Checking id is fine but you should also double-check any 'head office' telephone numbers printed on id cards rather than just calling the number you are given.

The main focus of activity has been on those engaging in off-road and offbyway trespass in pursuit of game and other illegal activities - particularly in East Grafton. The manner in which these vehicles are driven is often aggressive and dangerous and history shows that when these activities are stopped, other crimes in the area normally decrease. As a result, the byway at the end of The Green has been closed to four-wheeled vehicles. This is a temporary and emergency measure and notices have gone up accordingly.

Wiltshire Police have an immediate response to such incidents and hare coursing is currently a policing priority for this area. Please report sightings of any unfamiliar 4x4 vehicles if seen on farmland, particularly if they have lurcher dogs with them.

To report something to the Police, call 101 if there is no immediate danger or 999 if you feel there is an immediate danger.
