Neighbourhood Watch Update

The end of August report from the Pewsey East Policing Team included a number of incidents from our parish.

Wilton has suffered a non-dwelling burglary in which welding equipment and grinders were stolen, as well as criminal damage to crops. Damage to crops also occurred in East Grafton and in West Grafton, a chain and three padlocks were removed to gain access to farmland. In Marten damage was caused to a parked vehicle. Other crimes in the surrounding villages include thefts of and from motor vehicles and from non-dwelling buildings, as well as a drug seizure in Milton Lilbourne.

I have some news for you. Over the summer I was successfully elected to be the Vice Chair of the Royal College of General Practitioners. The RCGP is an organisation committed to promoting quality of patient care and I am immensely proud to have been given this opportunity to help to take things forward. My specific role will be to try to influence decision making about how the NHS operates. It will mean time away from the surgery. From November I will need to be in London on most Wednesday afternoons and Thursday mornings and perhaps other days, sometimes at relatively short notice. The period of office is 3 years. I really appreciate the support and understanding that I have had from patients who already know about this. It will mean that I am less available for face to face appointments in Bedwyn but I can assure you that overall access will be protected and remain at a high standard.
