Pewsey Deanery WW1 Service of Remembrance & Commemoration

St Nicholas' Church

10.45am for 11am Sunday 3 August

A Service is being held in St Nicholas' Parish Church, East Grafton on Sunday 3 August to mark the Centenary of the First World War and to remember, with pride and gratitude, those men from the Vale of Pewsey and the Savernake Parishes who, one hundred years ago, went off to fight for King and Country; many of whom did not return.

The Revd Michael McHugh, Rector of the Savernake Team, invites members of congregations across the Vale to join with those of Savernake Parishes on this National Anniversary occasion.

Music in Church will be provided by a Brass Quintet from the Band of the Rifles supported by the Bedwyn Millennium Choir. The Address will be given by the Revd Paul Abram MVO, a former Army Padre and Chaplain to HM The Queen.

Following the Church Service, the congregation will gather around the newly renovated Grafton War Memorial for the Act of Remembrance. The 26 Parishes and communities within the Vale have each been invited to provide the name of one man from their area who lost his life during the 1914-18 War. These names will be read out before the Last Post and Reveille sounded by Buglers from the Rifles, after which flowers will be laid at the War Memorial by a child from each Parish.

Those attending the Service, together with other visitors, are invited to remain to listen to a short Concert given by the Band and Bugles of the Rifles. A collection will be taken in aid of 'Care for Casualties' which is the Regimental Charity of the Rifles. This charity provides vital support for the casualties from the five regular and two Reserve Battalions of the Rifles. Since 2007, 60 Riflemen have been killed and 300 seriously injured, of which 34 have suffered life changing injuries.

News in Brief

Tree work in our conservation area

Wilton and East Grafton are in a Conservation Area and one of the responsibilities is that applications for work to be done on any trees must be submitted to Wiltshire Council regardless of whether the tree has an individual Tree Preservation Order (TPO) placed upon it. Failure to follow this requirement is inconsiderate to all those diligent residents who do abide by these rules. If you are not sure whether you fall within the Conservation Area, you can check on maps.wiltshire.gov.uk/LocalViewpub/Sites/NorthPlanningApplications or call Wiltshire Council for advice on **0300 456 0100**.

Prosecution for unauthorised works to trees can lead to a maximum fine of £20,000. This fine applies to a contravention of a TPO or works to a tree in a conservation area where proper notice has not been given to the Council. Certain trees are exempt such as garden or fruit trees, all trees under eight centimetres in diameter, trees that are either dead or dangerous and if the felling is in accordance with an approved plan under the Dedication or Forestry Grant Schemes.

Anyone wishing to carry out work on trees over 75mm in diameter within a conservation area has to give six weeks' notice of their intention to the council.

DOCTOR TIM BALLARD WRITES

Electronic or E cigarettes have produced quite a lot of controversy. Good thing or bad thing? I think the answer depends on who is starting to use them. It is the nicotine in cigarettes and other tobacco products which produces a change in the way the brain works that smokers find pleasant and is more addictive than some class A drugs. When someone, usually a teenager or young adult, starts to smoke they triple the number of nicotine receptors in their brain which amplifies the effect that the nicotine has on the brain. When someone stops smoking they still keep triple the numbers of receptors which is why just the one cigarette for an ex smoker can prove disastrous. So is it the nicotine that we doctors worry about? Apart from its capacity to cause addiction the answer is no. The problem is all of the other poisonous chemicals and the carbon monoxide in tobacco smoke that drive narrowing of the blood vessels which leads to heart disease and stroke.

With all of this in mind, our focus needs to be on society using E cigarettes in a measured way. For them to become cool and fashionable and appeal to the young is a big problem because they would create addiction and dependency just like smoking does. However, as an easily available nicotine substitute that can help smokers ditch the poisonous carcinogens that accompany usual nicotine addiction, we should look upon it as a boon.

Should people be able to use E cigarettes in public places? Personally, I think they should. Would I be happy for them in my waiting room or consulting room, well that's another question!
