OUR DOCTOR WRITES

You will probably know that there has been an announcement that the Care.Data programme has been put on hold for around 6 months. This is a welcome development and gives time for reflection and hopefully time to develop more clarity about how exactly the collected data will be used, what safeguards will be in place to protect it and produce a better way of explaining the programme for patients and doctors alike. I will keep you posted.

I carried out my first official role for the new members of our College in London this week. Welcoming (mostly) young doctors into our Royal College following their success in their exams. I was thrilled. They were an outstanding bunch and left me feeling that our health in times to come will be in good hands.

At the opening ceremony of the Olympics the NHS featured prominently. There was the quote about the NHS being as important as a religion in modern Britain. This got me thinking. Currently our society is changing and the care that the NHS provides is under stress from several different directions. We have an ageing population - great news. Fewer people are dying in young and middle age from preventable conditions. Society itself is changing with a move away from geographically stable nuclear families. More often than not children and grandchildren live miles away from their parents. Combine this with the move away from the supportive regular worshipping parish structure and we have a recipe for older people to be socially isolated at a time when many become vulnerable.

People can of course become vulnerable for other reasons and these changes to the structure of our communities can impact on them too. Over the last 50 years we have become used to the state, either via the NHS or departments of social services to be able to respond to social vulnerability. The recent period of austerity has highlighted that things will never be the same. When the economy picks up I doubt very much if we will ever return to a point where care capacity is as it was. It seems clear that if we want to live in happy caring communities there will be a need for them to be more resilient and less reliant on the state.

I began to think as well about the future of General Practice. Maybe there is a role to use General Practices up and down the country as a hub to facilitate community cohesion. It is easy to see how local social input is valuable, take our own link schemes but there is a need to go further. I wonder whether we will use our GP practices as a place to organise non medical groups that help to build friendships and link us together more so that if the going gets tough then there will be someone who might be able to help, someone you met at the knitting club that you saw advertised when you came for your blood pressure check?

If anyone is interested in taking these ideas forward let me know.
