

News in Brief

Wiltshire Good Neighbours

Fibre in the air?

It has been confirmed that surveys in both the Bedwyn and Burbage exchange area are underway to enable superfast fibre broadband. The official line is that premises in these areas should be enabled with 6 months, but it may be sooner, and should see speeds of at least 24Mbps. Unfortunately, there's not such good news for those in the Parish connected to other exchanges who will be waiting a little longer. You can find out more at wiltshireonline.org/index.php/broadband-rollout by using the postcode checker (though be advised that this is not 100% accurate as postcodes do not exactly map onto exchanges and cabinets). Further information will distributed via the Community News and the Parish Council as soon as it is available.

"With a 3.5% increase in fares from this January we have raised with Claire Perry the irony of the above inflation increase being used to fund rail improvements that might very well disenfranchise Bedwyn Station once electrification is installed as far as Newbury. We continue to press for a clear resolution as to how Kintbury, Hungerford and Bedwyn will be served post electrification. The passenger group's favoured solution is for the freed up HST trains (or similar) to provide an hourly Paddington to Westbury service."

Dr Tim Ballard writes

I thought I would return to a clinical theme this month. Thyroid problems are a relatively common problem that we see in General Practice. The average sized practice will have many tens of patients who have an underactive thyroid gland and a much smaller number with an overactive one. The thyroid gland produces a hormone called thyroxine this sets the speed at which the body metabolism works.

The most common causes of an overactive thyroid are when the body uses its own immune system, used effectively to fight off infectious diseases, to target itself. There are two common forms of this, one is called Hashimoto's thyroiditis and the other Grave's disease. The symptoms experienced by having too much thyroxine in the body caused by a raised general metabolic rate may result in palpitations, weight loss, tremor and diarrhoea. There is sometimes also an intolerance of warmth. With Grave's disease the immune system can also stimulate the fat pad at the back of the eyes causing them to appear bulging or staring. There are several different ways to treat overactive thyroid problems including taking medicines such as carbimazole, using radioactive iodine to stop the thyroid working altogether (usually reserved for older people) and surgical removal of much or all of the thyroid

Following over activity the gland may return to normal but it may become underactive at some point in the future.

Sometimes in later life people present with underactive thyroid glands with no knowledge or record that the first phase had ever happened. Having an underactive thyroid gland produces the consequences of having a lower metabolic rate, feeling chilled while others are comfortable, thickening of the skin and hair and constipation and weight gain are all recognised features. The treatment of an underactive thyroid gland is very straightforward simply needing replacement with a daily dose of thyroxine hormone (levothyroxine). Whilst having an underactive thyroid gland can be the cause of weight gain it is much more likely to be due to an excessive calorie intake over a long period.

Finally it's time for the annual round of Flu jabs. If you normally have one please contact us, online if you can, to make an appointment. It's free for over 65s, children aged 4 and under and those with a medical condition. If you are not sure whether or not you qualify for a free NHS flu jab, please ask.
