

#### **OUR DOCTOR WRITES**

I'm writing this on the day of Jeremy Hunt's speech to the House of Commons about the future of the NHS. I'm absolutely thrilled that he has seen the writing on the wall and is investing more into General Practice and Primary Care. To be clear this will be investment into the service and not the wallets of GPs! In particular I'm pleased that £10 million has been found to help practices who are particularly struggling. Currently I'm responsible for a program of work that offers support to practices who have been placed in special measures by CQC (The Care Quality Commission). We all feel that this is a drastic step and that it would be so much better to use early warning mechanisms and try to head things off at the pass before problems become so bad that practices end up being placed in this category by CQC.

I think there may also be a little more flexibility in relation to what seven day opening actually means. It would still be helpful for anyone with concerns about the impact on small rural surgeries (it would most likely lead to a reduction in availability paradoxically) to contact Claire Perry to voice this concern.

One of the ways that the NHS will be able to survive is by not rationing particular treatments that are felt to be not appropriate for the NHS to fund (assisted conception is often cited in relation to this) but for us to focus on wider over-diagnosis and over-treatment of people and to link this to true informed decision making between the doctor and the patient. Quite often statistical significance is mixed up with clinical significance. It can be proved that giving a drug to a lot of people makes it less likely for something (like a stroke) to happen, but as the level of risk leading to treatment falls then more and more people need to take, often lifelong, treatment to stop one event happening in that very large group. To be able to offer this sort of decision making consistently we need to invest in more time for doctors and nurses to spend discussing issues like this.

We are back in summer time and the rates of malignant melanoma (and other skin cancers) are worryingly high. Remember the Australian advice of Slip, Slop, Slap! Slip on a Tee Shirt, Slop on the sun tan lotion (factor 30) and Slap on a hat.

On our practice website you will find a link to join our wider patient group. Please consider joining this and doing your bit to help us in our ambition to continually improve our services. Please will you also fill in the Friends and Family test when you have contact with us. It might be a bit tedious but the rates of feedback that we can send back to the NHS are important in the way they view us which eventually effects our long term viability. There are cards in reception and you can complete the form on line as well.
