

News in brief

Everleigh Update

Following the 'consultation' on the Household Recycling Centres in Wiltshire and the proposed closure of Everleigh Recycling Centre, a number of reports and communications were distributed which served further to confuse Everleigh's future. As a result, the Pewsey Community Area Partnership (PCAP) provided contextual analysis to Wiltshire Council which showed that in fact Everleigh was far from being the least efficient Centre, when population figures are taken into account. PCAP also asked Wiltshire Council to provide 'a formal, unambiguous statement on Everleigh HRC which can be communicated to the parishes across the Community Area'. Wiltshire Council has confirmed that 'closure of Everleigh Household Recycling Centre is not included within the budget proposals for 2016-17'. Sadly, Wiltshire Council does not currently seem willing to look at the contextual evidence and still insists that Everleigh is the least efficient site. PCAP awaits a response from Wiltshire Council on the contextual data. The future of Everleigh is therefore far from certain.
