Why everyone should know how to use a defibrillator ...My story

After five glorious days in Copenhagen my travelling companion collapsed from a massive heart attack at Bristol Airport. Her heart stopped beating and she stopped breathing. Luckily a fellow passenger, a GP, was on the scene within seconds and relentlessly gave CPR until the defibrillator arrived. After 3 electric shocks her organs started to function and eventually she regained consciousness.

I have never felt so relieved and yet so helpless. At home I knew roughly where my nearest de fib is located and have never bothered to learn about CPR. My relief was twofold, most importantly my friend is alive and secondly her attack didn't happen while we were away, where she was dependant on me and expert help wasn't available. I vowed to make sure in the future I'd be able help others in similar situations.

I'll be on the next de fib training available. Shalbourne community fund have kindly lent me 'Annie' (the dummy) and the training defibrillator so I can learn at home what it feels like. I don't want to ever experience that feeling of helplessness again - join me and make sure it doesn't happen to you.

My friend was the fifth person at Bristol airport that week to have CPR and the defibrillator. She was the only one to survive - without the GP intervention and the amazing support from the teams at Bristol and ambulance service her story would be different. Timing and knowledge saved her life.

Be aware

On 18 September all the emergency services which support our area will be holding a demonstration day to provide information and entertainment. Participating organisations include Wiltshire Police, Community Safety, British Rail Transport Police, Wiltshire and Dorset Fire Service, Radio Wiltshire, Aldbourne Brass Band, British Horse Society, NFU, St John's Ambulance Training, Wiltshire Wildlife Hospital, Wiltshire Wild Life Trust, Swindon Young Drivers Self Testing. Side shows and competitions are included too!

Starting at noon on 18 September at Gt Bedwyn village hall, hay meadow and cricket club with free entrance and car parking.

This issue must, sadly, warn you about crimes being committed in our area. Recently there have been several incidents where tools have been taken from vehicles, rogue phone calls have been received asking for bank details and callers have taken a "quick picking" whilst distracting homeowners. Do be vigilant and do inform the police as soon as you can.

On a positive note our local Community Police Officer reports that several criminals have been apprehended following incidents in our area. On 18 September Great Bedwyn is hosting an event of music and information to help everyone to protect themselves. See the **Be aware** details on this page.

Our Doctor writes

This month the full text from Dr Paddon will be on the graftonparish.com website - here is an extract.

Hopefully we have not seen the last of the sun this summer and so I thought I would write about staying safe in the sun and how to minimise the risks and maximise the benefits of sunlight exposure. However the greatest risk factor for developing a skin cancer is from sunburn.

- Malignant melanoma risk increases regardless of whether sunburn occurred in childhood or adulthood, whereas with other types of skin cancers, the risk is higher in people with a history of sunburn in childhood. Risks which may not be readily considered include:
- Reflection off surfaces such as sand, water, concrete, snow and even if there is cloud cover you are still at risk of burning and you are if you sit next to a closed sunny window. Harmful UVA penetrates glass (although more weakly than direct exposure) and exposure over long periods of will cause skin damage
 - Skin type and your occupation also affect the potential risks and benefits. Some medicines increase your risk of burning - the antibiotics Lymecycline used to treat acne and doxycycline (sinusitis and chest infections), anti-inflammatory pain killers such as ibuprofen (nurofen) and naproxen, and amiodarone, a heart medicine, are the most common.

But Vitamin D is essential for healthy bones, and we get most of ours from sunlight exposure. Vitamin D helps the body absorb calcium and phosphorus from our diet, which are important minerals for healthy bones and teeth. Most people in the UK can make enough vitamin D from being out in the sun daily for 10 to 15 minutes with their forearms, hands or lower legs uncovered and without sunscreen from March to October, especially from 11am to 3pm. This is less than the time it takes to start to burn. Although people with darker skin will need to spend longer in the sun to produce the same amount of vitamin D.

Marten to get speed limit - At last..

After many years of perseverance the Parish Council is pleased to announce that we have been successful in our efforts to have the speed limit for Marten reduced from its current national speed limit of 60mph.

The new speed limit will be set at 40mph and this will be implemented over the next 12 months. The stretch of road from the A338 to the entrance to Marten will also be reduced to 50mph from its current national speed limit level.

Efforts to reduce/control the speeds in the remainder of the parish continue of course.
