Our Doctor writes

We have received the result of our CQC (Care Quality Commission) inspection in April in which we achieved a rating of GOOD. In addition to all the positive comments from the inspectors about the high quality of care, examples of outstanding achievements were highlighted in the report which is available on the practice website for you to read - **www.oldschoolsurgery.co.uk**. If you do not have internet access please contact the surgery and we will provide a copy for you. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the practice staff for their hard work and high level of commitment to provide the best possible care and to Dr Ballard for his inspirational leadership and support. Thank you also to all patients who participate in patient groups and surveys.

Dr Jenny Yin who was due to be joining us at the start of August for the final year of her GP training has not been able to do so. However Dr Stephen Griffin will be joining us in February 2017.

I attended a One Day Essential course on Men's Health run by the Royal College of GPs in June and wanted to write briefly about screening because men are much less likely to access screening than women.

The Bowel Cancer Screening programme is available to men and women aged 60 to 74. You receive a test kit and information leaflet in the post. The test detects blood in faeces and one of the possible causes of this is bowel cancer. If you have a positive test it is repeated and if it remains positive you are invited to attend for a colonoscopy to establish the cause of the blood.

Men aged 65 are invited to attend for abdominal aortic aneurysm (AAA) screening. The aorta is the major blood vessel from the heart supplying blood to the lower body which can become abnormally enlarged and if very large can rupture. Men aged over 65 are far more likely to have an AAA than women or younger men. The screening test for AAA is a simple, pain free ultrasound scan of the abdomen that usually takes about 10-15 minutes. If it is normal, you will not be invited for another screening. If you have a small to medium-sized aneurysm, you will be invited back for regular scans to check its size. If you have a large AAA, you will be referred to hospital to be seen by a vascular surgeon within two weeks.

Men and women from 40 to 70 years can book an appointment with a nurse at the surgery for an NHS Health Check. This takes 20 minutes and includes a check on blood pressure, cholesterol and blood sugar level.

A raised PSA level may be a sign of prostate cancer however the PSA blood test is not used as a screening test for prostate cancer in the UK. This is because other conditions can also cause a rise in PSA – in fact 65% of men with a raised PSA will not have prostate cancer. A biopsy of the prostate gland is required to diagnose prostate cancer, but this procedure can miss small cancers, be uncomfortable and has a risk of bleeding and severe infection. A very low PSA in a 45 year old man indicates a very low risk of cancer in the future. The higher the PSA, the greater the risk of developing cancer. Men are at higher risk of prostate cancer if they have a family history of prostate cancer, are of black ethnic origin, or are overweight or obese. If you wish to have a PSA test come and discuss this with a doctor. There is also helpful information available on the NHS Choices (www.nhs.uk) and The Prostate Cancer Risk Management Programme (www.gov.uk/guidance/prostate-cancer-risk-management-programme-overview) websites.
