The Parish Council meets bi-monthly and is made up of representatives from each of the villages - all with responsibilities for specific local matters. At the Parish Council meeting on Monday 11 March the following issues were discussed.

- 1. **Traffic** Concerns about speeding and traffic travelling through East Grafton on the A338 Mike Hyslop met with the Wiltshire Council Highways Officer and work is planned to improve road markings. A metro count is to be requested to identify actual traffic speeds and volumes and this will provide evidence for further activity such as a Speed Indicator Device or White Gates. Meanwhile regular Community Speedwatch takes place thanks to all the volunteers. Please email **clerk@graftonparish.com** if you would like to join the team.
- 2. Coronation Hall A new cleaner and maintenance co-ordinator have been appointed and feedback is very positive.
- 3. **Parish Husbandry** updates on footpath maintenance, parish noticeboards and playing field maintenance. Plans to repair the Skate Ramp and install a Zipwire were discussed.
- 4. *Planning* 2 applications in East Grafton and 1 in Wilton were discussed.

Our Doctor writes:

Easter, the only day that you can eat chocolate for breakfast!

I love chocolate. With that in mind and Easter approaching, I thought I would research the benefits of eating chocolate so that I can indulge a little!

- ⇒ Chocolate with a higher cocoa component is the secret to indulgence dark chocolate containing 70% or higher levels of cocoa are beneficial to health and contains less sugar and fat.
- ⇒ Dark chocolate is good for your heart, brain, mood and love life the antioxidants, plant sterols and cocoa flavonols found in dark chocolate have been shown to reduce the risk of heart attacks and strokes by lowering blood pressure, reducing 'bad' cholesterol and increasing 'good' cholesterol. In a Canadian study those eating 50g of dark chocolate per week were 46% less likely to die from a stroke. Research shows that dark chocolate improves blood flow to the brain and reduces damage to nerve pathways in patients with Alzheimer's. This has the potential to slow memory decline and may actually improve it.
- ⇒ Minerals such as iron, potassium, zinc and selenium are plentiful in dark chocolate. These are required for healthy growth and one study showed that eating one ounce (25 grams) a day during pregnancy might improve foetal growth and development.
- ⇒ Athletic performance may be enhanced by eating dark chocolate, which appears to boost oxygen availability. Cyclists who ate a small amount of chocolate before training used less oxygen when cycling at a moderate pace and covered more distance in 2 minute time
- ⇒ Cocoa has been shown to improve insulin sensitivity therefore dark chocolate in small amounts may delay or prevent the onset of type 2 diabetes.
- ⇒ A small square of dark chocolate melted on the tongue 30 minutes before a meal can trigger hormones which make you feel full. This will prevent overeating and if you do the same after a meal it will reduce the urge to snack. So eating chocolate can actually help you lose weight! Providing, of course, it is only a small amount of dark chocolate.
- ⇒ And finally, chocolate is an aphrodisiac! This is due to phenylethylamine (PEA) which is the same chemical the brain creates when you feel like you are falling in love. PEA also stimulates the release of feel good endorphins.

It would be irresponsible for me to write this article without a brief health warning. Chocolate, even dark, should be eaten in moderation. Chocolate high in sugar and fat will not give you any of the health benefits above and will rot your teeth. Some cocoa powders have high levels of cadmium and lead, which are toxic to kidneys and bones. The advice is to check the label to be sure of the nutrients. If your dog eats dark chocolate it can be poisonous.

So enjoy your dark chocolate Easter egg guilt free and with the knowledge that your heart, brain, mood and love life are benefiting.

News in brief

Notice of road closure in East Grafton

The Green (Part), Grafton; from its junction with A338 for a distance of approximately 40 metres in a southerly direction.

To enable: Thames Water to access and repair a valve located in the carriageway.

Alternative route: via The Green (unaffected length) - A338 and vice versa.

The closure and diversion route will be clearly indicated by traffic signs.

This Order will come into operation on 23 April 2019 and the closure will be required until 25 April 2019. It is anticipated that the works will take the stated duration to complete depending upon weather conditions. Access will be maintained for residents and businesses where possible, although delays are likely due to the nature of the works. The Order will have a maximum duration of 18 months.


