Our Farmer writes ...



Harvest has just started with the Winter Barley, always our first crop. It has been a successful year for the Winter Barley, it had a good start last Autumn and this Spring and early Summer had sun and rain almost exactly when required. The quality seems good and due to the lovely dry weather recently we harvested it in perfect conditions and didn't need to dry the crop prior to storage. This year, unlike last year, there is now a bit of a gap before anything else will be ready for harvesting, we may be waiting about a fortnight before the next crop, which could be Oilseed Rape or Spring Barley. Therefore, the next few weeks will be a time to try and get ahead with other jobs that get put off during the madness of harvest.

This week has been "Farm Safety Week", a national campaign to try to improve the safety record of our industry which is sadly languishing near the bottom of many a safety league table. Coincidentally we also had a visit from a Health and Safety advisor. This has been a very interesting process and highlighted a few issues I was completely unaware of and provided solutions for others. Farming accounts for 1% of the national workforce and yet is responsible for 22% of workplace fatalities (Source: HSE). This is a shocking statistic, one that, as an industry we must work hard to put right. Farming has undergone many changes over the last 100 years, not least increasing efficiencies through mechanisation. Tractors have replaced horses and subsequently got bigger and bigger, the workforce has shrunk as margins have tightened. Add to this the variety of jobs undertaken in isolation by many farmworkers around the country working long hours, often under time pressure, or the threat of an impending change in weather and the reasons for the poor safety record begin to reveal themselves. The solutions are not always obvious but some small tweaks can make a huge difference. Touch wood our safety record here is pretty good, but it is very important that we are not complacent and move forwards with safety a high priority, especially at this busy time of harvest.

On a lighter note, I gave an interview this week to BBC Radio 4's Farming Today about our No-Till System as part of their week focusing on cereal production. It was aired at 5.45am on Thursday 18th and 6.30am Saturday 20th July for those who may wish to listen back!

Hopefully we will continue to enjoy some warm, sunny and dry weather as we move into August. Harvest should really get going and all the schools will have broken up, ready to enjoy the Summer holidays.

Our Breakfast & After School Clubs provide care for up to 14 primary school children at the beginning and end of the school day for working parents and we are expanding this team.


Breakfast Club has to be functional and efficient - make sure everyone has a good breakfast and whisk off to school! After School Club has much more scope for adventure and creativity.

Whatever your ability, there is something for you to enjoy. From Parkrun to the more sedate Bedwyn Health Walks.

Walking has been proved to be the safest activity to help improve the health of older people or those with long-term health conditions, and has the added benefit of being a social activity in the fresh air which can also enhance mood and reduce isolation and feelings of loneliness. Promoting good health is as important as supporting you during times of ill health and so we at The Old School Surgery are excited to be part of the Bedwyn Health Walks Project. The Village Hall has developed the project in consultation with us at the Surgery to promote weekly health walks with the use of Nordic Walking Activator poles. The walks hopefully appeal to members of our community aged 18 and over who are living with long-term health conditions that affect mobility, those recovering from injury, or who have had an operation or treatment. You may want to become involved simply because you want to improve your physical fitness and wellbeing, especially if you have found yourself slowing down due to the passing of time, or just because you would like some company. You do not have to be registered at The Old School Surgery or live in Great Bedwyn to get involved.

These free, friendly and guided walks are on Tuesday mornings at 10.30am and set off from the Village Hall Car Park. You will be able to explore Great Bedwyn and some of the area for about 45 minutes at a pace suited to you, supported by trained volunteer walk guides. Activator poles, which help provide stability, improve balance and posture, reduce impact on leg joints and promote upper body fitness, are available for you to use. After the walk you can stay to enjoy a cuppa and a chat.

"Absolutely wonderful" were the words used to describe the walks by one our older residents.

Parish Council Meeting Summary Monday 8 July 2019

Minutes of Parish Council meetings are posted on all noticeboards and on www.graftonparish.com, but sometimes progress on concerns expressed by residents merit publicity via the Community News.

This is an extract from recent minutes which should keep you in the picture

"The committee agreed to invest money into traffic calming schemes as an investment for the future. Mr Hyslop proposed obtaining quotations for the purchase of 1 or 2 portable Speed Indicator Device (SID) together with costs for moving the equipment - to increase the impact by installing it along the roads most impacted by speeding vehicles. There are various models of SIDs available, some powered by solar and others with a battery with varying methods of securing this equipment. Mr Hyslop informed the committee that CATG (community Area Transport Group) has also agreed to review and improve road signage, improve road markings and review other traffic calming measures. Once completed they will review if the likes of white gates at both entrances to East Grafton could further encourage drivers to slow down. The work is likely to take 3 to 6 months to complete."

The police reported that "a gang from Marlborough and Swindon recently were convicted with a combined 57 years in jail for drug dealing"

The next full Parish Council meeting will be held at 7.30pm on 9 September to which everyone is welcome.
