Footpath closures January until March 2020: Footpath 25 (Part), Grafton; from its junction with C205 to its junction with Middle Road; Footpath 10, Grafton; from its junction with Footpath 25, Grafton to its junction with Grafton Road.

To enable: Canal and River Trust to carry out engineering works to the canal.

Alternative route: via Public Highways and Public Rights of Way.

The closure and diversion route will be clearly indicated by traffic signs.

This Order will come into operation on 6 January 2020 and the closure will be required until 20 March 2020. It is anticipated that the works will take the stated duration to complete depending upon weather conditions. The Order will have a maximum duration of 6 months.

Our Doctor writes following on from the Screening article last month......

The NHS Health Check is a free health check for adults in England aged 40-74 without a pre-existing condition. It is designed to spot early signs of stroke, kidney disease, heart disease, type 2 diabetes and dementia. You can expect to receive a letter from your GP inviting you for a free NHS Health Check every five years. You will be asked about your family history, diet and exercise. You will have your blood pressure and heart rate checked and a blood test for sugar and cholesterol. At the Old School Surgery this is done by our practice nurses and takes about 20 minutes. You are usually sent an invitation, but can make your own appointment if you are 40, 45, 50, 55, 60, 65 or 70.

Abdominal aorta aneurysm screening (AAA) is an ultrasound scan to check if there is an aneurysm, in the aorta. This is the main blood vessel that runs from your heart to your lower body. An aneurysm is serious if not spotted early because it can enlarge and eventually rupture. One of my patients recently had a scan and he said that although there was a lengthy questionnaire, the scan was simple and did not take long, about 10 minutes. He had a normal result and found this very reassuring.

Prostate cancer and the Prostate Specific Antigen (PSA) - this is an informed choice programme, called prostate cancer risk management, for healthy men 50 or over who ask their GP about PSA testing. It aims to give men good information on the pros and cons of a PSA test. The PSA blood test is not used as a screening test for prostate cancer in the UK. This is because it has not been proved that the benefits outweigh the risks. PSA tests are unreliable and can suggest cancer is present when it is not (false-positive result). If you wish to have a PSA test go and see your GP. There is also helpful information available on the NHS Choices and The Prostate Cancer Risk Management Programme websites.
