




Speed Watch

If you are concerned about the speeding through East Grafton and would like to make a difference, how about joining the Community Speed Watch Team? We have a small group of volunteers from the Parish who go out on a regular basis. Currently this is only in East Grafton as it is the only location that has met the criteria for the scheme. Each session lasts an hour, so it only takes up a small amount of your time once or twice a month but can have a great impact on the traffic coming through - both by reporting those who do speed, but also as a visual reminder for all of the 30mph limit. Our Doctor writes **Happy Valentine's Day**



Those not in a relationship or in an unhappy relationship, those recently divorced or widowed, those living with mental or terminal illnesses may all struggle with the ideals seen on TV, in advertising or on social media. Seeing others promote and celebrate their happiness, love and togetherness on social media can be hard and highlight feelings of being different and alone. Loneliness is simply about not feeling connected. The Royal College of GPs (RCGP) is increasingly concerned by the evidence which shows that loneliness and social isolation can be as bad for people as chronic health conditions. Loneliness puts people at a 50% increased risk of an early death compared to those with good social connections. Consequently, the RCGP has recently launched a campaign to tackle loneliness in the community. If you are lonely, socially isolated or would like to volunteer to help tackle loneliness, whatever your age, please contact your GP practice for more information. At the Old School Surgery our care co-ordinator, Mary Soellner, is the lead on loneliness and

social isolation. She visits socially isolated patients at home and has set up clubs for you to join in Great Bedwyn and the surrounding villages. Last Tuesday afternoon Shalbourne Connect had their first meeting in the village hall. This is a weekly meeting starting at 2pm to enable people to make those vital connections.

If your self esteem is low you may compare your relationship to portrayals of unrealistic and idealised relationships and think that you or your relationship are not good enough. Self esteem is about how you see yourself and how much value you see yourself having. Low self esteem can result in a lack of confidence, motivation and success. If you suffer from low self esteem there is help available. The Moodzone section of the NHS Choices website has excellent information about rising self esteem. The charity MIND also has information about loneliness and self esteem on their website. You can contact the Improving Access to Psychological Therapies team directly or through your GP to access a counsellor or cognitive behaviour therapy (CBT). CBT is a talking therapy which aims to help you manage your problems by changing the way you think and behave so it can help improve your self esteem.

Warnings from Action Fraud

Fake emails and texts purporting to be from TV Licensing are common. The messages contain links to genuine-looking websites that are designed to steal personal and financial information. Always question unsolicited requests for your personal or financial information in case it's a scam.

Malicious calls, voicemails, text messages or emails to members of the public purporting to be from HMRC are frequently recorded. The fraudsters state that as a result of their non-payment of tax or other duty, the victim is liable to prosecution or other legal proceedings such as repossession of belongings to settle the balance but can avoid this by arranging for payment to be made immediately by method such as bank transfer or by iTunes gift cards. If the victim is hesitant or refuses to comply, the suspect makes a threat such as immediate arrest, bailiffs or in cases where the victim appears to be of overseas origin, deportation.

Often, the period for which the tax is allegedly due is distant enough to guarantee the victim will have little, if any, paperwork or ability to verify the claims. Once the money is paid, the suspects stop all contact.

- Rules to stay safe:
- It is vital that you exercise caution when receiving messages or telephone calls of this nature.
- Never automatically click on a link in an unexpected email or text.
