Our Farmer writes



So the wettest Autumn in my farming lifetime is continuing on into the Winter months! This wet weather continues with the backdrop of the horrific fires in Australia, a country I have just returned from visiting and although fortunately I saw very little firsthand evidence of the fires, we heard horrific stories from those affected. Almost the most chilling conversation I had was with a farmer who told me that their bush fire season is normally February and March and we were only in December with the country ablaze. There can be no doubt that the climate is changing the world over.

We flew to Australia on an Airbus A380. These massive planes carry approximately 500 passengers and use 330,000 litres of fuel for a one way flight to Melbourne. That is over 9 years' worth of fuel use on our farm, during which time we would produce wheat for 23 million loaves of bread, barley for 152 million pints of beer, peas for 700,000 cans of mushy peas and 500 cattle for prime, grass fed beef. Now I am not for one second saying that farming is perfect or that no one should travel in aeroplanes but within the farming industry there is a feeling that we are being singled out as the bad guys in the whole Climate Change Debate when actually we all need to look at our personal carbon footprint and all make little changes to reduce our consumption of fossil fuels; reduce travel (or swap the car for the train where possible), reduce food waste (as a nation we throw away 1/3 of the food purchased), buy local to cut down food miles, reuse/repair more and recycle more. If we all do a little it will start to add up!

Back at home on the farm, everything is still very wet, so much so that some of our cattle have had to come into the barns, to spare the land from being churned up by the animals' hooves and to give them a break from the wind and rain. On the arable (crops) side of the business nothing is going to happen until the ground dries up significantly, at which point we will get very busy planting; not only on the land that we planned Spring crops for but also that which missed out in the Autumn due to the weather. There is still some extra decision -making to do. Due to the wet Autumn, there is an expectation that much more Spring Barley will be planted across the country this year which will, in turn, drive down prices. How much Barley do we plant, and what else do we plan for land not yet planted? One factor which will affect this decision-making will be how soon we are able to plant the crops. Some like Spring Barley and Beans like to go in early, whereas Linseed, Peas and Lupins still perform well if planted later.

Fingers crossed we get a spell of dry weather and those in Australia get some of the wet weather from us!

Tree planning applications: Before carrying out any tree work it is important to find out whether the tree is protected by a Tree Preservation Order (TPO), Conservation Area, or through another form of protection. You may have already been notified that a TPO covers trees that you own, either when the order was originally served or through a Local Land Charges search carried out by your solicitor prior to you purchasing the property. If you are at all unsure as to whether a tree is protected please apply for an explanatory pack for clarification.

Neighbourhood Watch meeting report

On 22 January, 36 people attended a very informative meeting, arranged by Chris Beale in conjunction with the Parish Council, to discuss how our community should protect itself following recent burglaries . Representatives from the Police, Neighbourhood Watch and Community Policing each gave a short talk about what they could do for us and what we could do to help them. Recommendations from these organisations are:

- ⇒ Keep in contact with your neighbours and watch out for anything suspicious around your area. A WhatsApp group is an easy way to join neighbours together and can be used to warn those around you of problems.
 - o The Parish Council is looking into the co-ordination of these groups to provide a parish-wide record of concerns to pass on to the
 - o If this solution is not available to you then please put a note into the Coronation Hall letter box and a parish councillor will to try to find a method for you.
- ⇒ Use 101 to notify the police of anything/anyone suspicious. If you are concerned and kept on the line for a long period then call 999.
- ⇒ Sign up to the Community Messaging service on which you can select areas of interest to you. **www.wiltsmessaging.co.uk** is the site where you can sign up for notifications from the police regarding a large number of categories from which you can choose to tailor the service which you receive.

A follow-up meeting is planned to see what progress is being made. This will probably be included in one of the bi-monthly Parish Council meetings or the May AGM meeting. Thank you to all those who presented and who attended the meeting.
