Our Doctor Writes

As you may know we have recently taken the decision that for most patients that we will not take telephone repeat prescription requests. We are committed to providing a local and personal service for our patients and unlike many other Wiltshire practices which have been offering online repeat prescriptions only for a number of years, it is with some reluctance that we have made this decision.

Online ordering service is a very simple process. Once you are registered, you have access to ordering your medication, booking appointments and if you wish access to your medical record and test results. With the majority of patients ordering in this way, telephone lines are freed up, receptionists are available more to deal with patient queries and the flow of work into the dispensary is more evenly spread out. In your next repeat order there will be a small wallet sized card detailing the turnaround times for prescriptions, and a space for you to make a note of your user name. Please keep this handy for when you need to make your monthly order.

Di Cuthbert retired from the Practice in August. Despite our best endeavours to find a fully trained replacement this has proved difficult, and as a result we have been training up another member of staff. We will continue our search in the meantime to strengthen our team. As a result of these changes our turnaround times have had to be adjusted to **three** working days instead of **two.** In time we hope to return to a two day turn around, but in the meantime would appreciate your co-operation.

With increasing numbers of patients, and more complex health issues, we are receiving an ever increasing work load of hospital letters/discharges etc. To ensure that GPs have access to this information in a timely manner it is vital that our reception staff have the time to process this correspondence Moving the time consuming processing of telephone prescription requests away from reception, will ensure that your medical records are up to date with all information available to the GP/Nurse. We have been working closely with our colleagues in local hospitals to get them to forward clinical letters by secure email, so that we can process them even quicker, so be rest assured our efforts are totally patient centred with you at the very heart of this.

But please note, we remain committed to helping the more elderly and vulnerable members of our community. If you genuinely do not have internet access, and there is no-one who can drop in your prescription request or collect your medication, then please speak to either myself or Donna Pais, and we will do our very best to find a solution for you.

Be Vigilant to tool theft. Warning from Wiltshire Police after recent events

Tools can be extremely valuable and if stolen can have a huge impact on small businesses. Wiltshire Police would like to remind all van owners to remove their tools from the vehicle when it is left unattended for long periods of time and overnight.

Follow these simple steps to help prevent you becoming a victim

- ⇒ Visibly mark tools using an engraving/chemical etching kit or a forensic marking kit
- ⇒ Keep a list of tools, together with any serial numbers and identifying marks
- ⇒ Don't leave tools in an unattended vehicle or overnight and put a sign in the window stating they have been removed
- ⇒ Consider fitting an alarm or internal security cage
- ⇒ If you have a garage, use it
- ⇒ If your van is parked on a driveway, consider installing security lighting
- ⇒ Check doors are locked. Consider installing additional locks for added protection
- ⇒ Secure access to building sites
