Local Farmers launch Southern Streams Project

Our local farmers have set up a farming cluster group called Southern Streams. It involves more than 25 different, but likeminded farmers.

The group covers 25,000 acres of land that delivers water to the rivers Dun & Shalbourne (tributaries of) or directly to the River Kennet. The area includes the end of the Pewsey Vale to the start of the Chute Causeway, along the North Wessex Downs to the river Kennet at Hungerford and to Savernake Forest.

The farmers in the group are all committed to enriching the landscape and biodiversity of our environment, whilst enhancing water quality in the rivers, streams, lakes and ponds. There are long term projects to capture water and prevent flooding to create wetland habitats. The aim is to increase woodlands and hedgerows as well as creating wildlife corridors on a landscape scale. The farmers are working to improve carbon sequestration and contribute to the national target of net zero carbon emissions. Once the group is fully established the Southern Streams logo will be on local signs and there will be a bird watching app on the website.

The plan is to extend facilities to include an outdoor table tennis table which can be used by all ages and natural climbing structures for young children.

An update on the situation regarding St Nicholas' Church from Michael McHugh (Vicar) and the members of the Parochial Church Council (PCC)

Readers will be well aware by now that our Church is closed because of falling small timbers from the roof, in addition to the Covid19 restrictions. Complications because of the height of the roof and the exact purpose of the timbers has been challenging for builders who have quoted for the repairs.

Three quotations for the remedial work required for the roof have now been received. An expensive part of all quotations received is the requirement for scaffolding which will cost around £12,000 including VAT. Prudent housekeeping has ensured that the PCC retained £10,000 in reserve for building works (originally earmarked as a contribution for the installation of a heating system). Costs for the work to repair/reinstate the timbers are likely to be £14,000 including VAT making a total cost of approximately £26,000. Grants are being researched although it appears unlikely that the total costs would be covered this way and therefore fundraising is essential.

The Church is a focal part of the Parish and the PCC is extremely keen to ensure that it continues to play a vital part in community cohesion. Winter Warmers, the vibrant services at important dates in the calendar (Christmas, Easter, Remembrance for example) and other community events are all part of the important role played by St Nicholas'.

APCM 29 April at 7pm The Annual Parochial Church Meeting will be held using Zoom. More details will be in the April issue. It is sincerely hoped that at this meeting a firm plan for the roof repair will be placed before everyone.

Our doctor writes a vaccination update

At the time of writing this article, the 65 to 69 year age group, the clinically vulnerable group aged 16 to 64 and people who are carers are presently being invited for vaccination. All 65 to 69-year-olds have been sent a letter from the NHS with information on how to book a vaccination online with the national vaccination programme. Although this letter states to wait for your GP practice to contact you if you would prefer to have your vaccination through your practice, I would like to advise you the practices in our Primary Care Network (KAMP, Burbage, Ramsbury and The Old School Surgery) are not actively telephoning this cohort. I am sure you can appreciate the clinically vulnerable group is huge and as the cohorts reduce in age the number of patients increases. We simply do not have the resources to telephone everyone. So please, please help reduce workload by booking online. If you are unable to book online or to attend a national booking centre please call your practice, rather than wait to be contacted. The PCN only has a few days notice that a batch of vaccinations is being delivered and the priority then focuses on the logistics of setting up clinics and contacting patients. All this is happening in addition to providing core GP services.

Please do not contact you practice about your second vaccination. At present you can expect your vaccination at, or close to 12 weeks after your first one. Your practice will contact you.

Every practice in the PCN have staff that are shielding and cannot be at work. The announcement that the shielding period is being extended until the end of March will impact every practice. At The Old School Surgery two members of our reception team are not able to work. Their work is being covered by the remaining reception team along with our administrative team, dispensary staff and our practice manager, Donna. This is not sustainable and going forward we have recruited temporary staff to help. They have all volunteered and are all young. Their training is limited and they will try their very best to help you. Ben Marren and Olivia Pais are 17 and Ben Drewett is 20. Dr Julia Hempenstall volunteered her children, but her eldest is only 9, so we declined!

Thank you for your wonderful letters and cards of thanks and appreciation. It gives us a huge boost whenever someone says 'Thank you'.

We are also enjoying all the cakes you bake. I assure you with the variety (lemon drizzle, fruit, blueberry muffins, Black Forest, apple, carrot) we are getting our 'five a day'. Take care, stay safe. Keep well!

Katie writes from Footsteps Podiatry Services

This past year has been a crazy year for everyone but in many different ways. I read one quote, which said, "We are all in the same storm but not in the same boat". Thankfully I am one of the lucky ones who can still work and my children are of an age where they can home school themselves. For this I am truly grateful.

Footsteps Podiatry has been present in Tidworth Leisure Centre since Feb 2011 but previously I had a clinic in Romsey since I graduated in 1999. To this day I still love the job I do and patients I meet everyday. From the young to the old, financially stable to the homeless, people that are on their own to the people with big families and pretty much everyone in between. Each and every one of my patients has an interesting story to tell.

We are all busy people leading busy lives. Let me put it like this, if I didn't brush my hair everyday it's going to get messier. The same goes for brushing our teeth, we need to brush twice a day for good dental hygiene.

We are always on our feet and tend to neglect them because they are covered up and out of sight. It's important to prioritise health and look after our body as a whole.

Although I do cut toenails there is a whole lot more to my medical training than just this. For instance, corn & callus debridement, nail surgery, under local anesthesia for in-growing toenails, diabetic footcare, filler injections to specific areas under local anaethesia, biomechanical evaluations for orthotics to name a few. At the same time as treating the patient for what they originally attend an appointment for, due to a detailed medical history plus conversation other things can be picked up like melanoma, diabetes etc.

My advice to everyone is to get a regular footcare health check, especially as we get older and less able to attend to our feet.
