Our Doctor writes



A headache, fever, nausea and muscle aches are common side effects after the Astra Zeneca vaccination. These side effects usually settle within 12 to 48 hours and simple pain relief such as paracetamol and ibuprofen can help.

However there is some evidence that the AZ vaccination can be linked to a rare blood clot in the brain. Symptoms include a severe, persisting and worsening headache especially when lying down, which is not relieved by simple pain relief. There may also be blurred vision, vomiting, difficultly with speech, weakness, drowsiness, confusion and seizures. The advice is that if anyone who has these symptoms for **four or more days** after receiving the AZ vaccination should seek medical help. Other symptoms include abnormal pinprick bruising or bleeding, swelling and pain in the calf muscle, chest pain and shortness of breath. Whereas persistent abdominal pain can indicate a clot in the veins in the stomach or bowel.

Fortunately, clots are rare with an incidence of less than 4 people per million vaccinated and more women being affected than men. The benefits of the vaccine far outweigh the risks, but the risk-benefit balance changes with age with a slightly higher incidence of clots reported in younger adult age groups and although the Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA) is not recommending age restrictions, it does recommend under-30s with no underlying health conditions should be offered an alternative vaccine where available.

The 45 to 49 year age group is being vaccinated at present. No vaccination provides 100% immunity. This means even if you have had both your first and second vaccination you can still catch Covid-19 and spread the infection to other people, especially those not yet vaccinated. In order to prevent this and keep everyone including those not yet vaccinated safe, you still need to keep wearing your mask, washing your hands, social distancing and following the rules.

Gill is growing flowers, and supplying bouquets, flower buckets (for those who prefer to arrange their own) and weddings and events too. Flowers are delivered locally and Gill will have flowers available from late May and all summer long into the Autumn.

Today 90% of the flowers sold through UK florists, supermarkets and wholesalers are imported not just from Holland but flown from as far afield as Ecuador, Colombia, Kenya and even Ethiopia, however over recent years there has been an increasing interest in British flowers, as flowers grown locally with limited road miles and zero air miles appeal to many. Gill's bouquets, buckets and arrangements will be a reflection of what is in season and at its best at the time of picking, flowers that you often won't find in shops.
