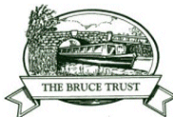
Each hamlet has its own WhatsApp Group which you can use to ask for, or offer, help. Call your co-ordinator for help in using this if you are unsure.

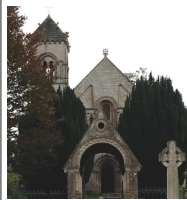

Our Doctor writes



The National Flu Immunisation Programme 2020/2021 is going to present some challenges. Concerns about COVID-19 are likely to increase demand as additional groups are eligible, including:

- all school year groups up to and including year 7,
- people who expect to share living accommodation with a person on the NHS Shielded Patient List
- and also health and social care workers providing care at home (although the vaccination is to be provided by their employer).

People aged 50 to 64 who are not in an at risk group may be eligible, but will only be offered a vaccination in November and December subject to availability after other eligible groups.

Social distancing must be maintained before, during and after every jab, PPE is changed and areas cleaned between every person to avoid the spread of coronavirus. Needless to say there has been a lot of discussion about how to deliver the 2020/2021 flu vaccination programme safely and efficiently. Public Health England is considering revised guidance for PPE use for all immunisation services.

In addition to the groups mentioned above, eligibility for the flu vaccine includes:

- Those 65 or over on the 31st of March 2021,
- Those aged from six months to 64 years and in an at risk group. This includes people with long-term health conditions such as heart and lung disease, diabetes, kidney problems, treatment for cancer,
- Pregnant women,
- Those in long-term residential care,
- Carers.

Children aged 2 to 11 on 31st August 2020 and children aged from 6 months to 18 in at risk groups are eligible. School children up to and including year 7 will have their vaccination at school.

The flu vaccination is safe and cannot give you flu. It protects you against two types of influenza A viruses including H1N1, which is the virus that caused the swine flu pandemic in 2009 and the 1918 Spanish flu pandemic. Influenza B is included, although depending on your age, you may only receive one rather than the two strains. Influenza B particularly affects children. The flu jab will not protect you against all the thousands of common cold viruses, so you can still catch a cold.

I would encourage everyone who is eligible to have a flu jab. The vaccinations are usually available from mid-September. At the Old School Surgery more information will be available nearer the time about how to book an appointment. Some pharmacies also provide a vaccination service.

News in brief

Hillbarn Estate report on trees in the Brails

The estate undertakes regular assessment of the health of trees at the Brails and the most recent report has confirmed the insidious advance of the disease called chalara in the Brails's ash trees. The disease is caused by a fungal pathogen - ash trees colonised by the fungus display symptoms including foliar leaf spots, dead leaves and shoots, sparse thinning crowns, branch dieback, dead wood, bark lesions, and tree death. Unfortunately once infected the majority of ash trees will die.

Several ash trees have been identified as being hazardous and will be felled this winter between Great Bedwyn and Wilton and along the Windmill road. The report has also identified several other ash trees for future yearly safety inspections which means that the felling of ash will almost certainly become a regular event.

The Estate is currently analysing the spread and effect of the disease on the existing woodland management plan and is working closely with the Forestry Commission to protect as many trees as possible.

Additional note from David Lemon on this subject: Ash trees lining the road linking Wilton and East Grafton are currently being assessed. Very sadly, the probability is that these trees will require felling.
