Our Doctor Writes by Dr Angela Paddon.

Last week I watched a film called Still Alice. This is the moving story of a woman living with early onset Alzheimer's dementia and the devastating effect the disease has on her and her family's lives as she struggles to remain a part of things and stay connected to who she once was.

The number of people with dementia is increasing because people are living longer and the prevalence rises with age. It is rare before 65, affects 6 in every 100 people aged 75-79, 13 in every 100 aged 80-84, 20 in every 100 aged 85-89 and a quarter of people aged over 95. This is normal age-associated memory impairment. Memory can also be affected by poor concentration due to tiredness, boredom, depression, anxiety and stress. An underactive thyroid gland or a low vitamin B12 and folic acid level can cause memory problems and infections can cause sudden changes in memory. Certain medicines including sedatives and painkillers can affect memory. Brain tumours, head injuries and long term alcohol abuse may be other causes of memory loss. Memory loss is often the first symptom noticed, especially memory for recent events. Language, attention, thinking, orientation, calculation and problem solving are other cognitive functions which become impaired. In addition to the cognitive decline there are behavioural changes which affect social behaviour, personality and emotions. The final component in dementia is difficulty performing the activities of daily living like cooking, eating, dressing, shopping and driving.

Alzheimer's disease is the most common form of dementia and accounts for 50% of all cases. Vascular dementia is responsible for a quarter of dementia cases. It is caused by reduced blood flow to the brain which results in brain damage. A single large stroke or multiple ministrokes can reduce blood flow and cause damage. Lewy body dementia causes about 15 in every 100 cases of dementia. Lewy bodies are tiny abnormal protein deposits that develop in nerve cells in the brain. The part of the brain affected is responsible for movement and so, in addition to the symptoms of dementia, there may also be symptoms similar to Parkinson's disease; stiffness, slowness of movement and a shuffling walk with difficulty in starting, stopping, and in turning easily. If you have concerns about your memory or the memory of someone you know, please make an appointment with a GP.
