After a nail biting wait it was announced that Cabinet approved the Committee's proposals completely and agreed to provide the capital funding to go ahead with the proposed project.

Save money on your energy bills

Wiltshire Council has announced a scheme in which householders could save hundreds of pounds on their energy bills.

It is known as a collective energy switching scheme and it is a bulk-buying project which enables every household in Wiltshire to join with other communities in the UK and become a single unit to negotiate cheaper energy bills. It is expected residents could see energy savings of between £60 to £200 a year.

Residents can now register their interest in being part of the switching scheme by visiting the Ready to Switch website – **www.readytoswitch.co.uk** – and

providing their details including energy usage information. There is no obligation to sign up for the tariff once it has been offered to you.

The cut-off date for registration is 17 December 2012, however the scheme will re-open for new applicants for extra auctions throughout 2013.

In response to rising energy prices and the increasing numbers of households in fuel poverty, the scheme is the first in the UK to allow residents who use prepayment meters to register (there are some restrictions however) and the first to

invite small and medium enterprises (SMEs) to take part. For full details, see **www.wiltshire.gov.uk**.

Local groups and Claire Perry MP work to protect local train services

Local transport groups have been working with Claire Perry to lobby for our future train services. Claire Perry took a huge folder of evidence, emails and letters from constituents to a meeting with the Rail Minister where he agreed to review the case to extend the Electrification project beyond Newbury to Westbury. This review is due to report by the end of February. Alongside this there is a plan to continue to press the bidders involved in the 'paused' franchise bidding programme to offer further improvements in terms of 'through ' trains to and from London Paddington.
