Community access to our grounds and gardens

Over the past several months there have been a number of instances where we have arrived in the morning, or after the weekend, to find that we have some clearing up to do before our children arrive. These have been mostly trivial incidents – flowers beheaded, toys left scattered in the gardens and sand trays filled with water. We've been happy to deal with them at a small cost as, in the absence of a play park in the parish, providing community access to our grounds and gardens means that there is somewhere for little ones to play safely.

Unfortunately we had a much bigger incident a couple of weeks ago. An external tap was left running overnight which resulted in major flood damage to one of our nursery rooms and significant damage to another. Of course we are insured – but it has cost us a great deal in both time and money and, more importantly, had an impact on our children as we had to close one room for over a week. We're pleased to say that the flooring has now been replaced and the room has re-opened but we are still in the throes of sorting out masses of paperwork.

We'd like to ask for your help to reduce future risk – will you help us to reinforce our community access policy with your family and friends? Our gardens and premises are designed and equipped with supervised pre school children in mind. This means that we would not expect to see children older than 5 years using the gardens and we would always expect these children to be accompanied by an adult. If you have children would you remind them of this and ask them to be considerate about accessing and using our gardens?

We are part of a wonderful community in Grafton Parish. This was demonstrated to us once again following the flood when many people arrived to help clear the room and in days following when many people offered their help. Thank you all very much.

NEWS IN BRIEF

Consultations

Wiltshire Council performs quite a number of consultations which feed into the decisions and changes that the council makes.

Next Pewsey Area Board

The next Pewsey Area Board will be at Bouverie Hall, Pewsey, SN9 5EQ on Monday 2 July 2012 from 7pm. It is a public meeting and so everyone is welcome.

Volunteering in Wiltshire

The Pewsey Area Board announced that Wiltshire has been chosen to pilot a ground-breaking scheme that aims to give real rewards to community volunteers. The county is just one of three areas in England that will trial the scheme, which aims to attract more volunteers by awarding them with time credits.

It will see volunteers given one credit for every one hour they give to the community. That credit can then be used by them, or a friend or relative, to 'spend' at participating organisations; such as a bowling alley or the cinema. Alternatively volunteers can donate their credits for the wider community to benefit from. Eventually it is hoped credits could be exchanged with other volunteers in the country, so people can enjoy attractions outside their area. The two-year trial is part of the government's White Paper called 'Giving,' which aims to make it easier and more attractive for people to donate to charity and become volunteers. It will be led by Wiltshire Council with the help of partner agencies.

Similar schemes run by a social enterprise scheme called 'Spice' have been successfully running in South Wales for seven years. In the year ending March 2010, there were 5,300 participants generating 200,000 hours of giving. The people behind Spice will be helping Wiltshire Council draw up plans on how the scheme will be introduced into the county.

Jubilee Service at St Nicholas'

On Sunday 3 June, at a special service of hymns, prayers and readings, 112 people celebrated The Queen's Diamond Jubilee in St. Nicholas' Church. The five villages which comprise the parish - East Grafton, West Grafton, Wilton, Wexcombe and Marten - were all represented and the congregation, led by Chris Stock from Chute, sang the patriotic hymns with great enthusiasm - enthusiasm very much inspired by the splendid solo singing of Nick Evans. Many people expressed the wish that this sort of service should become an annual event.

A crab-apple tree was planted in the churchyard after the service by children of the parish - of whom there seemed to be dozens in church - and then the whole congregation moved down the Green to the Coronation Hall where champagne and 'nibbles' were enjoyed by all, the champagne generously donated by Bill Clemence and Ronnie Pearson. After a short speech in which he remembered his role as a young lieutenant at the coronation in 1953, Mike Walsh gave the Loyal Toast which was followed by three cheers for Her Majesty.

It was a day which we will remember with gladness for a long time.



Our Doctor writes

 \sim I have just been listening to the Secretary of State for Health Andrew Lansley who remarked how important it is for patients to be able to access primary care and to see or speak to a doctor when necessary. For once I am in complete agreement with him. Each year I formally thank our staff for helping to make this happen. I suspect that getting a GP appointment can be more difficult in urban areas perhaps with large practices. In our recent practice survey (which you can access through our website or see the hard copy in our waiting room) you can see how we perform. You can also compare practices on the NHS Choices website. The feedback that we received reflected the Department of Health's strategy which is in short to make more effective use of information technology. We aim to make direct booking of some appointments available online. Whilst enabling those who wish to avail themselves of this facility I am also keenly aware that this must not disadvantage those who are not able to go online for whatever reason. Whilst some choose not to use e-technology there are many who can't use it for many reasons. I want to make sure that we don't inadvertently widen health inequalities.

As part of our drive to improve communication with our patients we are embarking on a campaign to collect mobile telephone numbers and preferred email addresses. Not only am I hopeful that this will improve the patient experience it will also help us be more efficient.
