The grant will be used to purchase a minibus allowing us to drop and collect children from local schools and some fantastic equipment for our indoor and outdoor spaces.

It's that time of year where the thieves target cars parked at beauty spots. There have been incidents reported of dubious looking workmen offering to tarmac driveways. In a separate incident, a suspicious phone call was received by a neighbourhood watch coordinator from a lady with a northern accent purporting to be working with the police. The caller did not provide any details such as a name or shoulder number which any legitimate police officer would do. In any situations which seem suspicious, such as these, you should contact Wiltshire Police on their non-emergency number - 101.

There have also been incidents in Grafton Parish including damage to and theft from the donation box at the Windmill and several thefts from outbuildings and gardens. The Police urge us all to remain vigilant and to help prevent the thefts by locking things away where possible. If you notice any suspicious behaviour, please call them on 101 at any time.

Our Doctor writes

Now that the Health and Social Care Bill has completed its passage through the House of Commons, I feel that the Bill has turned out to be a curate's egg, good in parts. The good part has been the introduction of clinical commissioning. This will help to inject a degree of appropriate perspective in the way that services are planned for patients. I think that this sensible part of the Bill has been a Trojan Horse used to bring in wholesale introduction of the private sector into the NHS. The fact that GPs will be at the heart of future service planning leaves me with the consolation that other effects will be somewhat tempered.

The Lancet has just carried a really interesting analysis focussed on the potential benefits of aspirin in cancer prevention. I have written about it in the past following a similar report in October 2010. This report was also strongly supportive of the use of aspirin in middle aged and older people to help to prevent the onset of cancer. Strikingly it also seemed to have a big effect on decreasing the chance of a cancer spreading if it did develop. There is a potential downside to taking aspirin with the potential for stomach ulceration and bleeding. Please feel free to discuss this with us at the surgery or if you aren't registered with us in Bedwyn then approach your own GP. It seems to take a long period to really start to reap the benefits of aspirin so it is best not to rush into taking it.
