**An inspiring new term**

Education is about so much more than lessons. School should be interesting and fun and we take every chance to promote this by getting our children out and about and inviting visitors in. Here is some of what we've been up to over the last term.

- We're working with the choir master from Salisbury Cathedral School and will be taking part in a concert at Salisbury Cathedral on December 7<sup>th</sup>. Singing raises the spirits and the children's voices are beautiful. See the article on page 3 for news about our Community Choir and come along to raise your spirits.
- Our School Council is working with our neighbouring schools in a School Council Network. They are looking at ways of developing our outside environment and some of our younger children visited RHS Wisley to look for ideas. We have lots to think about but our starting point is to set up a vegetable garden and start a gardening club – another activity that is good for the soul!
- Last term the children raised funds and built a bird table (with the help of Goff Beese – thank you Goff) for the gardens at Brendoncare care home in Froxfield. This term School Council members went along to present the table and meet some of the residents. Relationships between young and old in our communities are a source of great enjoyment for us all.
- Visitors to school included a local author whose book Pud-Swan is raising money for Naomi House, a talk about Jesus' teachings and a local mum who came in to talk about parenthood. Trips out of school have seen the junior class visiting castles and bringing history to life. Year 6 children joined their friends from Shalbourne Primary on a residential trip to Dorset, a very successful collaborative initiative for all.

There have been all the usual activities and more – sports coaching and sports festivals, our Harvest Festival and to top it all a visit from Ofsted. Our lively school is at the heart of our community and as we enter the exciting Christmas term we have lots more to look forward to.

The new Hall will be open for business during the first week in December and the facilities are really fantastic. There is a sprung floor, seating for 150 or space for 250 to dance under the natural oak beams which are stunningly lit. The audio and projection systems are ready and the fully equipped commercial kitchen and bar are just waiting to be used!

Parishioner, Tom Dobson, has made and donated a beautiful shield to commemorate the building of the hall. Look out for it when you visit!

During the initial phase we are planning to keep the hire charges as low as possible to encourage lots of use.

## Securing the future of our School

Shortly before the summer holidays, the Governors of Grafton CofE Primary School announced that it was seeking to 'partner' with another local school. Everyone involved with our school is committed to securing a school in Grafton for future generations and ensuring it remains a key part of our village community but we know that some change is necessary so that we become the first choice for parents in the parish. In this part of Wiltshire there tend to be 'larger' schools - one class per year group with 30+ pupils in each class, and 'smaller' with mixed age classes of around 20 pupils. We believe that the best of both worlds lies somewhere in between.

Our small school offers many benefits including small class sizes and high levels of individual attention – for example, every child in Key Stage 1 (Infants) has their reading listened to every day. However, some year groups are very small which makes it difficult to stretch all children. Partnering with another school will mean that year group sizes will increase and the education and personal development of children at the school will benefit.

This initiative is supported by Wiltshire Council and you may have seen that Easton Royal School has recently entered into a partnership with St John's in Marlborough.

We have had initial meetings with a number of neighbouring schools and Wiltshire Council, and we will continue to explore possible options during the next few months. Of course any partnership will be subject to extensive discussions about how it would work in practice including any travel arrangements. The Staff Team, Parents and others have been made aware of our plans and the response has been positive. We will keep everyone informed as our plans develop.

## When the lights go out

Have you ever wondered what would happen if there was a major emergency, such as a major road incident in the parish, or a nationwide power loss? Well, even if you haven't, you will be comforted to know that Wiltshire Council holds annual Emergency Planning Exercises to provide an opportunity for parish councils to simulate what they would do in such an event.

The most recent simulation given was that the sun had emitted solar flares – these in fact are a real threat and are so intense that they produce magnetic pulses with the force to destroy power grids by melting transformers. We had to deal with the emergency to the satisfaction of the emergency services in Wiltshire.

There will be more detail on how these "role plays" are done and how to join in next time in another issue of the Community News.

In the meantime Southern Electric said that both of the recent outages we actually experienced were due to something being on the line and blowing the transformer. Southern Electric has checked the line in the area that went down and have cleared all vegetation. They said that if people notice branches that are touching cables (or suspicious looking nest building squirrels near transformers!), to contact them on the Emergency Number **08000 72 72 82** and they will deal with it.

### Don't be a heart attack victim.

#### You are never too young to be affected.

If you suffer a cardiac arrest, your heart goes into a rapid, chaotic and lethal rhythm called ventricular fibrillation (VF). If treatment does not occur within 10 minutes, your chance of survival is nil. Given that an ambulance will struggle to make it to our parish in 10 minutes, it is really important that our community is not only equipped with Public Access Defibrillators (PAD's), but that we are also trained to know what to do.

We have just one free training session left on 19<sup>th</sup> November – it's almost full, but we could squeeze a couple more people in! Contact details are below.

PAD's cost about £2500 and our aim is to equip each of the 5 hamlets in Grafton Parish, making a grand total of £12,500. This is ambitious, but we've done exceptional fundraising before in Grafton Parish and so we are confident we can do it again!

All major retailers are listed including Tesco, Next, Ebay, ELC, Amazon etc and all give a percentage of the order value each time you buy via the giving machine. As those who fill their tanks regularly know prices will always vary and in the run up to Christmas they generally rise. If we can get a minimum order of 10,000 litres placed by November 23<sup>rd</sup> then it will cost 37.2p per litre (1p less than current price and this will be held as prices rise, as they are expected to do).
