**Scrapstore at Goslings**

Grafton Goslings will be having fun with craft activities over the next few months and have added to their craft box with a visit to Scrapstore.



Scrapstore is a Wiltshire based charity who collect 'scrap' from organisations and make it available to schools, children's groups and families for use in craft activities.

Their warehouse near Lacock is a real Aladdin's Cave with scrap of every shape and size – from cardboard, to fabric, plastic shapes to wool and foam. The items are donated by companies when they would otherwise go into landfill.

Anyone can visit Scrapstore and fill a plastic sack with scrap for a suggested donation of £6 - £12. Scrapstore often do local visits and events too.

They will be visiting the Wesley Hall in Marlborough on Thursday 23 September 9.30am – 11.30am everyone is welcome to drop in – there will be scrap to purchase and craft ideas to try out on the day.

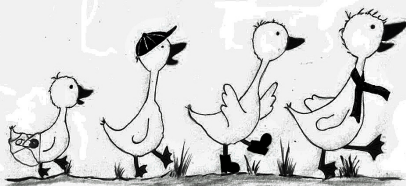

### A note from Rodney, The Vicarage, Great Bedwyn

I still remember my first harvest in Devon, when I was aged just 5. With the other small boys I waited, stick in hand, to catch any rabbits bolting from the centre of the field as the reaper and binder worked its way inwards. Later the church was decorated with sheaves of corn, apples and all sorts of vegetables. The celebrations were real: in that village, everyone who could help had helped. The good harvest promised that rationing might end soon.

Nowadays only a few in our communities are actually involved in the harvest of our fields. Most of us see the combine harvesters working the fields but have no idea whether the harvest has been good or bad - it seems there will always be food in our supermarkets. But the prices we pay, and even the availability of food, still depends on farmers, somewhere, to bring in a harvest. That is why we gather each year to give thanks that we have food to eat, and also to recognise the efforts of our own farmers, the custodians of the countryside we treasure.

In St Nicholas' Church, we shall gather for a Family Harvest Service on Sunday 26 September at 11am. We shall give thanks that we have food and enough – millions all over the world do not. The church will be decorated with the produce of our fields and gardens – I'm sure that a lot of the marrows started life as courgettes! Then on Monday evening, in the new Coronation Hall, we gather for a Harvest Supper.

This is actually a major fund-raising event for St Nicholas' Church. It helps us pay our way and keep the building open for the benefit of everyone who lives in the Parish. It is true that, years ago, the Church Commissioners had what seemed like lots of cash, and paid most of the costs of churches up and down the land. Now, sadly, what little they have left is almost all swallowed up in clergy pensions. Each church has to find the funds to keep itself going and pay for its share of a parish priest. If any community wants its church to remain as a place of celebration, of joy, and even of sadness, then that community has to make the effort to support its church.

I look forward to seeing you on Sunday 26 and Monday 27 September.
