The owners of the trees are aware and the trees will be felled soon – and the Parish Council understands that replacement trees will be planted.

Many parts of the Parish are within Conservation Areas and if you wish to fell or prune the roots or branches of a tree, or carry out other work which might damage a tree in a conservation area you must inform Wiltshire Council at least six weeks in advance. Parish traffic limits under review

Wiltshire Council has reviewed speed limits on all A- & B-class roads throughout the county and recommendations have been made for changes to speed limits in our area. The A338 has been identified for a speed limit reduction, to 50mph, from the east on the stretch from the Tipsy Miller junction to the East Grafton 30mph boundary and again from the western East Grafton 30mph boundary to the Burbage roundabout. Please note these are only proposals at this stage - any change of speed limit is subject to consultation and legal process. A further study of C-class & unclassified roads will follow in due course.

It has also been agreed to review the usage of roads through Wilton, as it seems that Sat Nav systems have resulted in an increase in Heavy Goods Vehicles passing through the village and the introduction of a weight-limit restriction on this route is under discussion.

Finally in the next few weeks vehicle speed surveys will be undertaken using the Metro Speed equipment in East Grafton and on the FairMile near Wexcombe. This will allow us to determine the nature of any speeding issues so the Police can address these as appropriate.

Housing Development in the Parish expected to be limited for years to come

Across Wiltshire there will be a need for 44,400 new homes by the year 2026 of which around 500 are planned to be in the Pewsey Community area - this includes larger villages such as Pewsey, Bedwyn and Burbage as well as Grafton Parish. Some 300 of these 500 homes have already been built or have planning permission in place. Given the limited infrastructure (shops, public transport etc.) in the Parish it is envisaged that housing development will be very limited.

If you are interested in finding out more about the strategy for Wiltshire, you can access the full document at www.wiltshirecouncil.gov.uk. The consultation period has now closed, but if you have any views, you can register them with the Parish Council for consideration at Area Board or Area Partnership meetings.

Congratulations on beating the conditions and maintaining excellent service!

Mobile Library

Did you know that there are regular visits by the mobile library to the Parish? The libraries hold books and for adults and children of all ages as well as story tapes, CDs and videos. The vehicles are wheelchair accessible. Customers can reserve items not available on the van. To borrow items you will need proof of your name and address such as an allowance book, bank / building society statement, driving licence or utility bill.

How to avoid a fire in your home or office

Now that work is completed on the Pypers Barn East Grafton, after the severe fire damage in 2009, it is timely to tell you of fire prevention services available.

You can call your local fire department 01380 723601 and request a free "Home fire safety visit" or you can use the online home risk assessment (if you do not have internet access then why not come along to one of the IT sessions in the Hall and do your assessment there?)

The free home fire safety visits are carried out by operational crews, they are completely free and you may be eligible for a free smoke alarm. You will not be sold anything.

Community fundraising

Filling your oil tank? Don't forget that we hope to organise a community bulk buy in February – details in the next edition. If you need to order in the meantime then Wessex Petroleum give 1/2p for each litre of oil bought. Call 0800 980 6172 and quote charity reference D19 (Coronation Hall and Friends of Grafton).

Buying online? Go to your normal online retailer via www.thegivingmachine.co.uk. All major retailers are listed including Tesco, Next, Ebay, ELC, Amazon etc and all give a percentage of the order value each time you buy via the giving machine at no extra cost to you. Select either Coronation Hall or Grafton C of E Primary School as your beneficiary. Encourage your friends and family to shop this way too and this could be a great way of supporting your community organisations.

Donating a tax refund: If the Inland Revenue calculates a refund for you then there is an alternative to banking these small sums. Please think about passing on those few refunded pounds to the Coronation Hall fund.

There is a list of charities to which you can donate when your tax refund is notified to you. IR tax forms/web pages include the GRAFTON CORONATION HALL (Grafton is added to the name to make sure that you donate to OUR Coronation hall!). There are a multitude of village halls on the list so we are not unique in taking advantage of this tax break!

A good idea? We think so!

Grafton Parish is very lucky to have so many exclusive visits from Santa especially on Christmas eve and again on Christmas day. The 180+ people who consumed the mulled wine and mince pies at the Swan on Christmas day were all very appreciative of everyone's contribution and effort.
