### News from Bedwyn Surgery

We're hoping that updates from the surgeries will be a regular feature and recent 'Our Doctor Writes' articles are available on the Bedwyn Surgery website at **www.oldschoolsurgery.co.uk/downloads** in the meantime the following may be of interest.

Prostrate Cancer – Dr Ballard reports that he is often asked why there isn't a screening test for prostate cancer but until recently the effectiveness of testing has not been proven. A recent British Medical Journal has however shown that whilst a one off test at age 60 could exempt certain individuals from ongoing surveillance it recommends that Doctors should individualise their testing for those in higher risk groups.

NHS Funding – over the last few years Bedwyn and Burbage Surgeries have benefited from an element of funding called 'Growth Funding' – this amount (nearly £100,000) is being withdrawn starting in April 2011 and funds will be allocated to reward surgeries who manage within their overall budgets, although exactly how this will work is not clear at this time. This reduction in funding is a quite significant for small practices that struggle to realise economies of scale and whilst both surgeries will be working hard to deliver the highest quality of service Dr Ballard and Dr King would appreciate your patience and understanding.

Free Essential First Aid Training for Parents – Parents of children registered at Bedwyn Surgery can benefit from free paediatric first aid training courses this autumn. The courses, funded by Bedwyn Surgery and run in conjunction with Angels First Aid have had great feedback from previous participants.
