The playing field looked amazing and luckily the forecast bad weather held off until the end of the evening. There was an opportunity to see photographs and memorabilia going back many years and a huge, fantastic cake had been made in the shape of the school. A BBQ supper was provided by The Swan Inn which everyone enjoyed whilst listening to a string quartet.

The evening was rounded off by the burying of a time capsule in the school garden – the capsule had been filled earlier that day by the pupils and staff, with the last item being the school bell. The cake was cut by Dave French, who it was claimed was the oldest former pupil of the school attending the event. Current pupils put in special requests for certain parts of the school building and playground when receiving their slice of cake! Finally Jill Parr, Head Teacher and General Michael Walsh made short speeches to round off the evening.

Thank you to everyone who contributed to the event – especially the 30 or so helpers who pitched in as the event closed to pack everything up before the heavens really opened. The marquees were finally down and everything into the school buildings by 10.30pm – a fantastic community effort.

Earlier that day the children had marked their last day at Grafton School with a special sharing assembly and then at 2pm the traditional leaver's service at St Nicholas. Whilst sadly this year, everyone was leaving - Alex Cox (in Rodney Harrison's absence) led a lovely service with a theme of 'New Beginnings', Luke Turner read a passage from Genesis and the children spoke about what they were looking forward to at their new schools.

The children have enjoyed many special activities and trips in their last term at Grafton. They have been to London to see the Lion King and a trip on the London Eye, to Legoland, to the Beach and to Marwell Zoo. They also enjoyed walking to Wilton Windmill followed by an art afternoon at school with help from Hilary Arnold-Baker. We recognise that this process will exclude anyone who isn't on email, but it is better that we do this as a simple non labour-intensive solution rather than do nothing. If you don't have access to email, then a neighbour who is on-line may be able to let you know if any notices come through.

#### Emergency air horns and defibrillator update

Cardboard & Plastic Recycling – Blue-lidded bins will be delivered in November to everyone automatically and the service will commence 2 weeks after this.

#### **Our Doctor Writes**

A few weeks ago I was asked to put on a presentation followed by a Q&A session about the NHS reforms. This was because there was a feeling that there was a lot of misinformation and a generally poor understanding of what the proposed changes in the Health and Social Care bill could mean. The NHS future forum has recommended some key changes to the original proposal.

- more collaborative approach to health commissioning with decisions focussed on providing integrated person centred care.
- the Secretary of State to retain responsibility to provide NHS care for the population rather than to promote it.
- the ability of private companies to enter the NHS and provide services remains. It will be interesting to see how the option of using them plays out in the future.

Whatever finally happens though we are in the jaws of a dilemma with a need for the NHS to become more effective and efficient. This will inevitably lead to hospital closures, although in an area like ours the district general hospital, in our case GWH will remain. But it is highly likely that the care that is delivered there will need to be radically restructured with much more care delivered in innovative ways out in the community.
