The end of July also sees Rodney Harrison retire after 9 years of being team vicar and his last service at St Nicholas' Church will be on Sunday 17 July.

Following the success of last year's Community Camp this year's event will take place on Friday 1 July, there is also an opportunity to meet Claire Perry, our MP at a coffee morning at the Coronation Hall on the same day.

Grafton Primary School – summer closure

The six week statutory notice period regarding the closure of Grafton Primary School came to an end on 2 June. One appeal from a potential Grafton Parish resident was received by Wiltshire Council and this was discussed at a Cabinet meeting on Tuesday 14 June, but the outcome of the meeting was to confirm that the school will close with effect 31 August 2011. All current pupils have places confirmed at alternative schools of their choice and transition arrangements are being agreed to ensure as smooth a transfer as possible. Work has started to facilitate closure, but staff and governors are ensuring that this is all behind the scenes and that the children's experience at school continues as normal until the end of term.

A Special General Meeting of the Friends of Grafton will take place at 2.30pm on Thursday 14 July to agree a resolution that the association be dissolved. All members of the Friends are welcome to the meeting.

The Sunflowers management committee has developed a business plan covering the growth of Sunflowers into the school building – the first version of this has now been completed and sent to the Diocese. Contrary to the report in the Gazette & Herald the future use of the buildings is now the subject of much discussion and as far as the Sunflowers team are aware one other party have expressed an interest in use of the buildings. The Management committee is confident that Sunflowers will continue to flourish, and will potentially be expanding the childcare provision to include full day care for babies and pre schoolers and after school/holiday provision for primary age children.

Wiltshire Council has offered Grafton Parish Council the opportunity to take ownership of the school playing field through a Community Asset Transfer. This was discussed at the last Parish Council meeting and the transfer was agreed in principle. The legalities of the transfer are now being completed and discussions will continue about the future use of the field, including the possibility of developing a play area.

We will continue to keep the wider community informed of progress regarding the use of buildings and land through future editions of the Community News.

COMING SOON : The Sporting Event of the Year – The return of the Wexcombe 10 km Run – Sunday 18 September

In aid of The Alzheimer's Society and St Nicholas Church, East Grafton

With 3 months to go it is time to start training for this prestigious event in the calendar. The run is single lap and traffic free at Wexcombe Manor Farm. The event includes a 10km run, a 5 km walk, a children's 1.2km Fun Run for 8+ year olds as well as the obstacle course races for younger children and a tractor ride. There will be a barbecue, refreshments and cakes. Please support us either by burning off some calories whilst running or walking or you can just come and eat cake and cheer on the runners. Any help with marshalling will be appreciated so please do let us know. In the meantime, here are a few tips to help you plan your training schedule:

- Dig out your trainers. It is an off road event so you will need trainers with some grip. Encourage your children to get out running too.
- Start training gently to build up stamina. Walking/running intervals is a perfect way to start – eg walking for 1 minute then running 1 minute, slowly increasing the running intervals. If you are a seasoned runner then build up to the 10 kms (6 miles) gradually.
- Always warm up and cool down and stretch sufficiently afterwards to avoid injury.
- The run is a multi-terrain event with a hill or two so don't practise only on roads and do include some hill work. (The Roman Road at Wilton is a perfect training location!)

A new thatch information pack for residents of thatched properties has been launched to help reduce the risk of fire. Although fires in thatched roofs are fairly rare, the devastation caused can be immense. The pack includes information on how to prevent a fire to what to do in the unlikely event of a fire starting. The Fire Service has also worked with a master thatcher to learn the best way of removing thatch from a building that is on fire and this has dramatically reduced the time taken to do this. Our Doctor Writes: As may you know the coalition government has opted to have a "pause" in the programme for proposed NHS changes. I'm sure that the broad thrust of the changes will remain intact following this consultation. The plan is to make the way NHS services are purchased and organised more clinically focussed and mainly under the control of GPs working in consortia. This could see more competition and more involvement of the private sector. The outcomes of the consultation may mean that private providers may be less prominent and that there will be more collaboration with other clinicians and local authority representation which I think is a good thing. So where are we locally at the moment? Over the last few years we have been part of the East Kennet cluster of practices. These practices are Great Bedwyn, Burbage, Pewsey, Ramsbury and Marlborough. This grouping has worked really well and we have managed to put in place some useful changes and been the only group in Wiltshire over the last few years to make savings on our budget and in turn have money returned to us to invest in local care. Unfortunately this grouping isn't big enough to manage to function and provide all of required activity of a consortium. We are therefore in the process of joining a bigger working group of practices in the area of north Wiltshire. We are aiming to maintain much of our autonomy though within this bigger grouping.

Exactly what will happen with the eventual deliberations of the NHS Future Forum being chaired by Professor Steve Field remains uncertain. What I can tell you though is that the way that we are responding to the agenda I'm sure will protect the local NHS and the services that you have become used to as much as is possible. I'll keep you all posted... Dr Tim Ballard
