Our Doctor Writes

I'm often asked whether there is anything that can be done to change the natural history of wear and tear (osteo) arthritis. The three contenders that come from pharmacists or from health food shops are glucosamine, fish and rosehip extracts. Studies have been carried out looking at glucosamine and it was certainly found to be safe. It was also found to have a great placebo effect. It has not been shown to be of much reproducible direct benefit in multiple studies and this is why the NHS won't pay for it. Fish oils have their place and have been shown to help with heart attacks and cholesterol but joints are another story (or a lack of another story come to think of it!). Rosehips contain an anti inflammatory galactolipid – GOPO. This has indeed been shown to be helpful in rheumatoid and osteo-arthritis. But the compound needs to be extracted at low temperature and in low light to preserve it and I am not sure if this is how it is done by high street manufacturers. It maybe worth a try, but it isn't available on prescription.

News in brief

Wiltshire Community A community bank scheme has been launched in Wiltshire which will provide people with a range of useful financial services, which include affordable credit, savings, standard loans and budgeting. Community Banks are nonprofit making co-operatives, where members pool their savings to lend to one another at minimum interest and help to run the credit union in a not-for profit way. In order to join the Wiltshire Community Bank people must live or work in Wiltshire and will be required to pay a lifelong joining fee of £2. Once a member, people can start saving as much as they can afford from £1 up to a maximum of £10,000. All savings are secure and protected by the Financial Services Compensation Scheme.

The new Pewsey Campus scheme is aimed at delivering access to public services (such as meeting rooms for Citizens' Advice, Police and other public service providers) at a location that is more local to you - and the committee is looking for your input.

They recognise that for parishes in the east of the Pewsey area (such as Grafton), Pewsey may not be the most convenient location for residents to get to. There is potential therefore for a satellite site to operate closer to us but in order to influence this, you need to go to the public session at the Coronation Hall on Saturday 19 November from 10am to 12 noon where you can find out more about the plans and provide your feedback.

When it snows remember the golden rule

SHOVEL, SWEEP and then **SALT**. Do not use water, even boiling water. You can use table salt and you only need to spread thinly 1 tablespoon to 1 square metre square of path or pavement to be effective. Large salt stores, provided by Wiltshire Council, are held in main farm barns in our Parish.




The Annual General Meeting of the Wilton Windmill Society will take place on Friday 9th December 2011 at 7.30pm at the Coronation Hall, East Grafton

One of the piles at the back was encroaching on the grave of Private Russ, who was one of the Grafton men to perish in the First World War.

More than 40 villagers and friends turned up with their wheelbarrows and garden implements 29 October and worked ceaselessly all morning to clear the huge mounds of debris. About 700 barrow loads were packed into a farm trailer with the help of Frank Silk, from Wilton, who was an expert on his digger, and Wayne and Dave from Manor Farm Wilton.

The Church and the Churchyard are now beautifully clean and tidy all ready for the Remembrance Service on Sunday the 13 November at 10.45.
