Sunflowers at Grafton - full speed ahead

As we speed towards our 31 October opening date we feel very proud of what has been achieved so far but conscious that there is still a great deal to do! So very soon we will be offering full day care for babies and children up to 5 years old – that means 8am until 6pm, 51 weeks a year. Plans for after school and holiday clubs from January 2011 are progressing well and we hope to be able to report in more detail next month.

Work inside and outside the building is close to completion. We're delighted to report that our recruitment has been very successful – we had a great response to our advertising and have recruited an amazing team. Our marketing has swung into action – Open Mornings, banners, posters and flyers are spreading the word. And as a result of all our efforts children are being registered with us – fantastic.

One of our Open Mornings was combined with the World's Biggest Coffee Morning on 30 September. We raised just over £130 for Macmillan Cancer Support and had a lovely morning in the sunshine. Thanks to everyone who made cakes and came along to consume cakes and coffee. Our Annual General Meeting will be held on Tuesday 18 October at 1.30pm, you are welcome to join us, and on Thursday 27 October we have a Community Open Evening from 6.30pm to 8pm – an opportunity to catch up, ask questions and see what's been happening. We hope to see you there.

We're delighted to be able to continue with a policy of considerate community access to our secure gardens during evenings and weekends when Sunflowers is not open. Please bear in mind that the equipment and resources in these gardens is suitable for the use of pre school children supervised by an adult. Providing community access should not cost us either time or money but we have had a couple of incidents over the past couple of months that have been a little disheartening. For example a sand tray being filled with water which meant we had to replace the sand, toys left scattered across the gardens and alcohol bottles and cans in the playground which means time taken by members of the team to tidy up. Please help us by ensuring that you help to take care of our grounds and gardens.

How can you help? Are you dividing plants in your garden at the moment? We are planning to spruce up our outdoor space and any contributions would be gratefully received. Our Doctor Writes

In September the Health and Social Care bill was passed in the House of Commons and now moves to the House of Lords. There is still an enormous amount of disquiet amongst the profession about the planned changes to the NHS. My biggest worry is that the forced introduction of multiple providers will fragment and duplicate services. This makes strategic planning for health much more difficult. I'm sure it's true that competition can drive up standards and improve service but it should perhaps be used by those planning services rather than a consideration for every decision. The original idea was that the GP or clinical commissioning groups could be any size and would enable GPs to have influence and plan care for patients in an area that they knew well. There is now talk of the House of Lords requiring a minimum of 250,000 patients per group – thus becoming like PCTs! It will be interesting to see where this finally ends.

A reminder that the flu vaccination programme is underway and that if you know you are entitled to a flu jab please have one, if you are not sure please ask.

Finally I read with interest that simple things are effective in restoring the performance of the middle-aged man in their love lives. For those with mild or occasional problems, increasing exercise in line with guidelines for cardiovascular risk reduction helps quite a lot. Now where did I put my walking shoes?

Pewsey Campus - Your Service Centre, Your Say

You may have heard about the new Pewsey Campus which is aimed at delivering public services at a location that is more local to you.

A committee has been working on what form the Campus should take and you may have already contributed your views through the questionnaire that was sent out last month.

Based on the questionnaire findings, the committee is now investigating the set up of a split campus in Pewsey (based at the Leisure Centre and the new Library) providing:

A modern Leisure Centre, including high quality swimming provision for both able and disabled swimmers, a full range of indoor and some outdoor facilities and a modern Youth Centre, including skateboard park;

Provision of a flexible space for meetings and use by a wide range of community service partners and Wiltshire Council (social, welfare, support, advisory – for example Police, Citizens' Advice Bureau, etc. could be included);

The current library, with examination of the potential for further exploitation of the new facilities.

Recognising that the Pewsey area stretches a considerable distance between the west and east boundaries and that Pewsey is very much to the west of the community area, the committee is also investigating the possibility of a satellite site for the provision of community services to Burbage and eastwards (including Grafton) on a shared basis with the main Pewsey campus.

To develop the scheme further, a public session is being held in the Coronation Hall on Saturday 19 November from 10am to 12 noon in which you can find out more about the plans and provide your feedback during this important consultation period. The Campus is for your use and so it is important that it provides the services that you need – please come along!

Sunday Morning Service at St Nicholas. 27 November

On this last Sunday of November we welcome the first of our special guests invited by the PCC, to conduct a morning service at St Nicholas. The Rev Christopher Walker will join us at the usual time of 11am for a celebration of BCP Holy Communion.

Christopher was born during the War, the son of an army family. He joined the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst direct from school and was commissioned into the 17th/21st Lancers. He served with his Regiment in Germany, Cyprus, Northern Ireland, Trucial States and Libya. On retirement as a Lieutenant Colonel he trained for the Church at Salisbury and Wells Theological College and was ordained in Salisbury Cathedral in July 1987. He returned to the Army, this time as a Padre in the Royal Army Chaplain's Department and for the past ten years has served in retirement as Chaplain to the Royal School of Artillery at Larkhill.
